hat makes Kano Emirate the most unique and long-standing Emirate in the country are its inherent historiography coupled with its ability to absorb and merge individual national and transglobal identities into a singular Kananci cultural identity.

"Of all the grand emirates of Northern Nigeria, none has the spectacular and expansive history and cultural anthropology recorded like the emirate, now emirates, of old Kano," says Professor Abdalla Uba Adamu Daneji, a double professor in the Department of Information and Media Studies.

Delivering the first ever Coronation Lecture on Thursday, 1<sup>st</sup> July, 2021 at the Convocation Arena, the immediate past Vice Chancellor of the National Open University of Nigeria (NOUN), Professor Abdalla Uba, noted that the state of Kano would for a long time to come continue to lead in the admiration of others for its rich cultural heritage and unique way of doing things not only in Nigeria, but in a global arena.

The lecture, titled **Kano Emirate: Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow** was part of the activities lined up for the coronation of the 15<sup>th</sup> Fulani Emir of Kano, Alhaji Aminu Ado Bayero. Prof. Abdalla also gave the background to the historical evolution of the Emirate and its spectacular contribution to the socio-cultural,

hat makes Kano Emirate the most unique and economic and political development of Nigeria in long-standing Emirate in the country are its particular, and the West African colonies, in general.

"The Kano Emirate having evolved over one thousand years has undergone tremendous transformation in all aspect of its development. By 2021, Kano has retained its lead as innovatory Emirate incorporating, as it does, not only all the antecedent structures outlined, but also capping it with total acceptance, expansion and development of new ones," said the University don.

He further argued that both the city, the Emirate and its traditional institutions have immensely benefitted from relative structural and narrative stability, thus, making Kano the most unique Emirate in the country.

Tracing the history of Kano as a ritual city, Professor Abdalla disclosed that the earlier settlers of the city lived at the base of the towering Dala inselberg and located near water ways of Jakara River in which they developed a religious fixation of paying tributes to the spirits of the river. However, the arrival of Bagauda sometimes in 999AD turned the small settlement to a more organized administrative city, thus, providing an organized leadership which they hitherto lacked. This paved the way for the beginning of the Emiral system in the city.

He went further to explain the various transformations of Kano as an mercantile city, a scholastic city, a colonial

city, an industrial city and now a bustling media hub.

## **NDLEA Partners BUK on War Against Drug Abuse,**

#### As VC, Mrs. Ganduje Bag Anti-Drug Campaign Ambassadors By Nura Garba

Umar Ganduje, were conferred with the title of stiffer punishment on people caught selling illicit drugs. Ambassadors for the campaign of drug abuse and other illicit drug trafficking.

The duo received the investiture when the National Drugs Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA) commemorated the United Nations International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Drug Trafficking on Saturday, 26<sup>th</sup> June, 2021 held in Bayero University, Kano.

The Kano State NDLEA Commander, Malam Isa Mohammed Likita, said the United Nations had set aside the 26<sup>th</sup> June of every year to commemorate the war against the cultivation, manufacturing, sale and consumption of illicit drugs and remind the people of the danger associated with the ugly trend in order to draw the attention to take appropriate action.

The Commandant said it was pertinent for the NDLEA to collaborate with Bayero University, Kano in the fight against drug abuse, especially among youth and women, who were vulnerable in the society, saying that research has shown that abuse of drugs remained the catalyst for kidnapping, armed robbery, rape and insecurity. He said that there was the need for collaboration among various stakeholders to nip the ugly situation in the bud.

Presenting a paper on the Effect of Drug Abuse on Females, Dr. Bello Ibrahim of Sociology Department said drug abuse was caused by economic, socio-cultural and psychological factors and that some people were pushed to it by pleasure seeking, anger, frustration and socialization.

Dr. Ibrahim averred that drug abuse was now common among females between the ages 25 and 29, including married women, saying that its negative consequences expected to be the leaders of tomorrow. "If such trend had lead to poor performance in school, divorce, continues, the future of the society looks absolutely

> He advocated the need for the intervention of the mass media to disseminate information on attitudinal change and called for the commitment of religious and community leaders to join hands with the law enforcement agencies to fight the menace.

> The speaker also called for government to fund the law enforcement agencies, such as NDLEA, and that the promotion of moral and ethical behaviors in the Nigerian institutions should remain sacrosanct.

> In her remarks, the wife of Kano State Governor, Dr. Hafsat Ganduje, commended BUK and NDLEA for coming together to organize such an important sensitization seminar with the aim of addressing the social menace militating against the development of the society. She said it would be suicidal to fold arms and allow the girl-child and women to partak in drug abuse, saying that would not be tolerated.

> She advocated for a door to door campaign to track offenders with a view to bringing them to book, calling for community and religious leaders to take huge responsibility of protecting the society against the vice.

> While declaring the day open, Mrs Ganduje recommended for the screening of civil servants during employment, so that culprits would be detected in good time.

## **FEES Organizes Seminar Series on Talking Environment**

needed to address all the social, economic and environmental challenges currently facing the country, the Director General/CEO, National Space Research and Development Agency, (NASRDA), Dr. Hallilu Ahmed Shaba, stated when he made a presentation on the topic, Geospatial Technologies and Real-time Solution: Potentials, Challenges, and Nigeria's Readiness on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of June, 2021 at the Faculty of Earth and Environment Sciences during the monthly talking environment seminar.

Dr. Shaba spoke on the constituents of Geospatial Technology, which included Satellite communication, Remote sensing, Global Navigation satellite systems and Geographic information system, Geospatial technology offers a wide range of innovative and cost effective solutions for environmental sustainability.

He noted that many countries including Nigeria now appreciate the relevance of geospatial technology in the sustenance of their environment. He also mentioned some application areas of geospatial technologies like mapping and management of the marine ecosystems, disaster management, agriculture, food security and climate among others.

The NASRDA boss further explained the roles of the Navigation System, Global Navigation Systems (GNSS), Earth observation satellites and GIS in real-time monitoring of event, saying that recent advancement in geospatial technology now enabled monitoring the environment near real-time. This is made possible through the increased presence of EO satellites in orbit, providing satellites images on a daily, weekly and monthly basis.

He disclosed that the role of NASRDA in aiding Geospatial technologies in Nigeria was brought to the lime-light on

Geospatial technology is an essential technology that is the launch of six satellites, which were Nigeriasat-1(2003), NigComSat (2007), NigeriaSat-2(2011), NigeriaSAT-X (2011), NIGCOMSAT-1R (2011), Nigeria EduSat-1 (2017). Other roles of NARSDA in advancing geospatial technology in Nigeria include the reactivation of the NASRDA road map, increased collaboration with both public and private organizations, capacity building and increased institutional reach.

> However, he disclosed some challenges of Geospatial Technology in Nigeria to include, among others inadequate funding of programs and projects, lack of access to cutting edge hardware and software to bridge the current gap, lack of an enabling environment to support and promote the use of advanced computational systems and machines and poor policy implementation in the adoption and adaption of geospatial technology in critical areas of governance.

> In the aspect of readiness, factors hindering the growth of geospatial development must be dealt with, factors such as low education and outreach programs on geospatial, administrative bottlenecks, corruption, lack of synergy among MDAs/private sectors, poor educational system and the inability to pursue the technological development of the country holistically, the problem of unstable power supply and communication pitfalls, to mention a few.

> In attendance were the Dean of the Faculty, Prof. Ibrahim Baba Yakubu, HOD's, other Principal Officers of the faculty and also the representative of the MD Hadeja Jamare River Basin Authority, Alhaji Ibrahim Tudunwada.

## CDA, JR Biotek Foundation Conduct Training Workshop on Molecular Laboratory

Foundation conducted a hands-on plant molecular biology laboratory training workshop held at the CDA from 28<sup>th</sup> to 2<sup>nd</sup> July, 2021.

The training workshop funded by the Global Challenges Research Fund was part of JR Biotek Foundation's Reach and Teach Science in Africa flagship program, which aims to advance agricultural research and innovation to achieve food security in Africa.

Speaking through zoom platform, the founder and President of JR Biotech Foundation, Dr. Carol Ibe, expressed pleasure in welcoming outstanding early-career agricultural researchers from Nigerian universities and research institutes to participate in this high quality laboratory training facilitated by excellent researchers.

She said the training workshop would avail the participants the opportunities to learn new transferable scientific laboratory skills and connect with other researchers, possibly leading to new professional relationships and collaborations that may promote new avenues and perspectives to solving Africa's challenges.

According to her, JR Bioteck Foundation's vision was to train, inspire and empower Africa's present and future research and bio-industry leaders, who would effectively tackle food and nutrition insecurity on the continent.

Dr Ibe further commended the immense contribution of CDA, saying that "we can work together to transform Africa's agricultural sector into a productive, effective and efficient sector that provides useful opportunities and practical solutions to sustainable food production.'

In his welcoming remarks, the Director, Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA), Professor Jibrin Mohammed

The Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) and JR Biotek Jibrin, said the training was apt and timely, considering the geometrical increase of population without corresponding food production in Africa and the persisting food loss. "We have problems of pest and diseases which devastate our crops. In Africa the loss is so high."

> The Director further said that there was the a need for cutting edge science and knowledge of molecular biology to address some of the problems that constrained food production, which the training workshop provided. He urged the participants to learn well and apply the knowledge into practice to help solve the perennial Africa's food security challenges.

> "You can also train others so that we have mass human resources that can assist in tackling our problems," said the Director CDA, Professor Jibrin.

> The main objective of the laboratory hands-on session is to demonstrate the basic principles of molecular biology, including the Polymerase Chain Reaction (a technique used to amplify genomic DNA from plant or animal tissues), complimentary DNA synthesis by reverse transcriptase, real-time or RT-PCR, and the phenotypic characterization of root infecting mutualistic fungi in maize and peanut.

> In addition to the hands-on training is a Bio innovation for Africa Pitch Challenge developed to encourage African scientists and stakeholders to work more collaboratively to develop solutions to some of the most pressing challenges hampering Africa's sustainable development. This initiative is the 4th edition whilst previous editions have led to the creation of innovative projects (in Africa) that are making a huge impact on smallholder farmers and farming systems in the region.


