



## 'Sustain the Confidence of our Foreign Research Partners', VC Advises ...As BUK, Two UK Universities Won Juicy Research Grant

The Vice-Chancellor Prof. Sagir Adamu Abbas has advised staff of the university to continue to sustain the confidence of our foreign research partners, as a selling strategy.

Professor Abbas pointed out that, such would go along way towards uplifting the image of the University as well as opening more windows of opportunities and collaborations.

He also stressed the need for accountability, transparency in project delivery and management.

The VC was responding to the brief received from a three-member research co-leads from Bayero University Kano, led by Prof Jibrin M. Jibrin, Director Centre for Dryland Agriculture on Wednesday, 28th July, 2021.

Earlier, the Director CDA, Prof Jibrin M. Jibrin informed the Vice Chancellor that Bayero University Kano, which collaborated with Leeds University and York University in the United Kingdom to develop a proposal early this year, has now successfully won a grant from the United Kingdom Partnering for Accelerating Climate Transition (UK PACT)

The project is funded by the UK Department for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS).

The grant, valued at 412,000 Pounds, is for 12 months, with two trial sites at Kano and Jigawa States.

The game-changing research is premised to investigate irrigation-free indigenous tree restoration strategy as a nature-based solution for tackling climate change and wider socio-economic crisis in northern Nigeria.

The UK Government decided to offer the grant despite massive cuts in its foreign aid and existing research grants, as a result of COVID-19 related economic challenges.

On the UK side, the team was led by Dr. Martin Dallimer from the School of Earth and Environment, Leeds University, Professor Lindsay Stringer from the York University in the UK. On the Nigerian side, the BUK team was led by Prof. Jibrin M. Jibrin (CDA), Prof. Ibrahim Baba Yakubu (FEES) and Dr. Aliyu Barau (FEES).

## Islamic Finance Panacea for Hajj Management, Says Director, IIIBF

The Director, International Institute for Islamic Banking and Finance (IIIBF), Professor Binta Tijjani Jibrin, has expressed the need to embrace Islamic financial practices as a solution to militating against Hajj operations in Nigeria.

She made the remark on Tuesday, 27<sup>th</sup> July, 2021 at a 5-day Customised Training on Islamic Finance and Hajj Management organized by the International Institute for Islamic Banking and Finance (IIIBF) for the staff of the National Hajj Commission of Nigeria (NAHCON) held at the Centre for Dryland Agriculture, Bayero University, Kano.

Professor Jibrin who highlighted the nexus between Islamic Finance and Hajj management stressed the need

for Hajj savings to be guided by the principles of Islamic Finance.

She said, however, that Hajj management in Nigeria had a very tumultuous journey looking for solutions but Islamic Finance would take us to the promise land.

According to her, Hajj and Islamic Finance are the sectors of the same ecosystem called the *Halal Economy*, hence the need for synergy because the funds required to perform the Hajj need to be halal.

She argued that the relationship between the two sectors would boost the halal economy and bring about development to the country in general. She added that Nigeria had the potential to deepen the Islamic financial market by mainstreaming in Hajj management.

Earlier in his opening remarks, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas who was represented by the Director, Centre for Dryland Agriculture, Professor Jibrin Muhammad Jibrin said the aim of the workshop was to sensitize staff of NAHCON on the need to embrace Islamic Finance so as to enhance their operations, particularly Hajj savings.

In his presentation, titled the *Shari'ah Aspects of Islamic Finance*, Dr. Warshu Tijjani Rabi'u stressed that the strict prohibition of interest in Islam was a result of its deep concern for the economic, moral and social welfare of mankind. He suggested that Islamic Finance was the only solution to economic problems.

The workshop, which attracted senior management staff of NAHCON is expected to close on 31st July, 2021.

## FUK Matriculates New Students...

The Federal University of Kashere is to establish three research centres this year, the Vice Chancellor Professor Umaru A Pate had revealed.

Speaking on Friday, 16<sup>th</sup> July, 2021 at the Matriculation of the newly admitted students for the 2020/2021 academic session, the Vice Chancellor disclosed that plan were underway to establish three new research and training centres in the University.

“The University had applied to the National Universities Commission (NUC), to establish three new specialized centres for Research and Training for Conflict, Peace and Gender Studies, Sugar Research and Climate Studies respectively,” said Professor Pate.

According to him, the proposed centres may likely take off before the end of 2021, explaining that the desire was to make FUK one of the leading institutions in research and academic excellence.

In the same vein, he said the Management had set up a Committee of experts, which signaled the commencement of the process of establishing a College of Medical and Health Sciences with a view to starting degree programmes in Medicine, Nursing and the Health Sciences.

Already, he revealed that at the beginning of this academic session, the NUC had given approval for the commencement of seven new degree programmes, which included Mass Communication, International Relations, Procurement Management, Entrepreneurial Studies, Public Administration, Marketing and Library & Information Sciences.

Turning to students, he charged them to be of good conduct and behavior and have a good and excellent relationship with host communities as well as avoid drugs and/or cultism.

He also advised them to respect and appreciate diversity always and tolerate the differences and heterogeneities in our country, promising that the Management of the University would always ensure it protect the interest of students, who were law abiding and peaceful.

The Vice Chancellor disclosed that as part of his policy to strengthen relationship with the host community, the Management had approved the establishment of a scholarship support fund to aid disadvantaged undergraduate and postgraduate students of Kashere and surrounding communities enrolled in the University.

A total of 3,448 students made up of 2,319 males and 1,129 females were matriculated.

Similarly, five academic staff and one technical staff were celebrated for their promotion to various levels which he described as magnanimity of the Management that will boost the morale of the concerned staff.



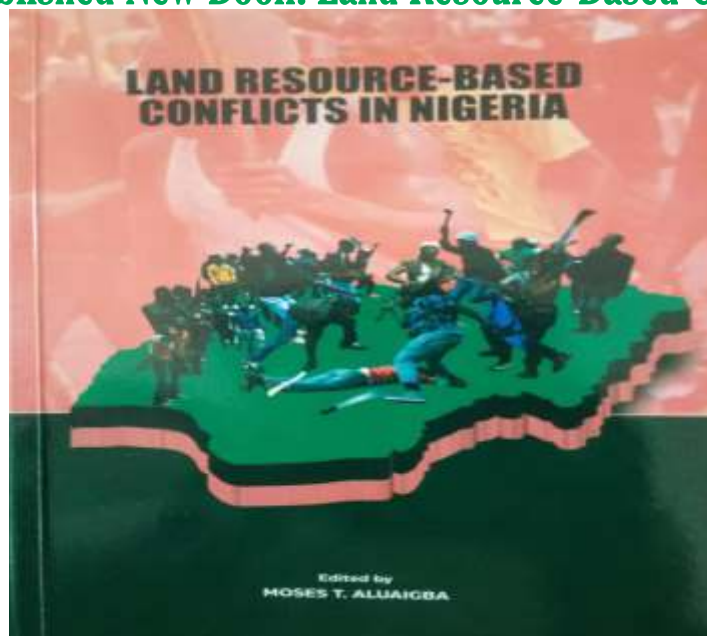
