



48th Professorial Lecture: Democracy is Meaningless without Good Governance ...Professor Kamilu Fage

Democracy will have no meaning to the common man until most of his basic needs are met and his standard of living significantly improved, a Professor of Political Science, Kamilu Sani Fage, has opined.

“Democracy is, and will remain, meaningless if its practice fails to showcase its goodness, namely serving the people and subjecting the leaders to the whims and caprices of the led,” he declared.

Delivering the 48th Professorial Inaugural lecture titled “**From Dividends’ Optimism to Dashed Hopes: The Imperatives of Leadership Reengineering in Nigeria**” on Thursday, 8th July, 2021 at the Convocation Arena, Professor Fage insisted that Nigerians must be made to taste and feel the universally acclaimed sweetness of democracy at all cost, otherwise, the system will lose its viability and essence in the country.

Critically reviewing the performance of democracy in the country in the last two decades, he lamented that Nigeria's leaderships since the fall of 4th Republic have woefully failed in its undertakings.

“It has become obvious that the high hopes of Nigerians has been substituted with despondency and frustration occasioned by bad governance that has paid lip service to the yearnings and aspiration of the people,” he lamented.

The Professor of Political Science however, hinged the failure of Nigeria in terms of delivering good governance through a democratic system for sustainable development on leadership failure through the imposition of bad elements in the position of authority at all levels.

He noted that election which ought to serve as a weapon for the replacement of bad leadership was however, turned to a mere ritualistic gimmick.

“Consequently, rather than being a means of posturing accountability in office, elections have become a ridiculous means of giving false legitimacy and approval to the inordinate ambition and self perpetuation bid of petty tyrants and autocrats in office,” said Prof. Fage.

According to him in contrast to their predecessors, contemporary leaders in Nigeria, put personal interest above those of Nigeria's and Nigerians. As a result of all this, “they not only see politics as a business enterprise but also seek public office not so much for service to the people but for the wealth and grandeur and prestige that come with it.

“Dividends of democracy continue to elude large segment of the Nigerian populace due to the character of the political elite who are devoid of altruistic aspiration and who see the occupation of public office as an investment to uplift self rather than an avenue of public upliftment,” he declared.

However, as a panacea, he suggested a number of policies to facilitate the re-engineering which include;

political/leadership reorientation by way of leaders re-dedicate themselves to service delivery, legal and constitutional reforms, holistic anti corruption crusade, productive youth engagements, political and civic education and public value reorientation among others.

Earlier, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, described Professorial Inaugural lecture as one of the important activities towards promotion of learning and research.

He said the Management of the University had placed greater premium to this all important activity and said efforts are being made to encourage members of the academia to come forth and present their lecture.

Professor Abbas while describing the title of the lecture as, catchy, apt and timely, hoped that the researchers knowledge would be used to dissect the numerous politico-socio economic problems facing the society.

The Vice Chancellor commended the Inaugural Lecture Committee for its consistency, commitment and steadfastness and urged would not to relent in this direction.

According to them they had the feelings that such sophisticated laboratory equipment could only be seen in some advanced countries but found them at the CDA, noting that it was difficult to see such equipment anywhere in the country.

The participants who were drawn from universities across the country, expressed optimism that the impact of the training would be significantly felt by their colleagues.

According to Paul Abayomi, a PhD student from Federal University of Technology, Abeokuta, said when he applied and later chosen to attend the training, he came with a completely empty mind of what was going to happen. "After five days of intensive laboratory practical and training, I realized that this is the best hands-on training I have ever attended throughout my life."

In his remark, Dr. Obaiya Utoblo of the University of Jos said the training had really manifested the competence of

CDA and JR Biotech Foundation which really showed that there is a glimmer hope for Africa in the future.

Promise Kenkwo from Michael Okpara University of Agriculture stated that with the caliber of trainers and the sophisticated laboratory equipment, Africa is ripe for

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, has commended the Faculty of Earth and Environmental Sciences for being academically active.

He made this commendation when the Dean of the faculty, Professor Ibrahim Baba Yakubu and his team paid him a

courtesy visit on Tuesday, 22nd June, 2021 at the VC's Board Room.

He said the team was on a visit to the Vice Chancellor to notify and brief him on the key issues bedeviling the faculty. He said certain components of programs run in the University collaborated with the Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) and that the faculty, which lacked proper facilities to function, had up to 30 PhD students from other African countries.

While responding, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Abbas, who was also a Board Member of the teaching hospital, said the relationship between BUK and AKTH was a special one, considering that it was the only teaching

hospital that doesn't bear the university's name.

He assured the visitors that the University would continue to support AKTH from all angles.

"We will see the possibilities of giving additional generators to the hospital," he said. With regards to staffing, the VC said the University would do all the necessary arrangements by seeking approval from the federal government agencies concerned.

He said some courses in the faculty were field-based and there was the need for an additional 50-seater bus to complement the 28-seater bus on ground.

He said the faculty, which had the largest expanse of land among other faculties within the University, was expected to be green and properly landscaped. He, therefore, solicited for intervention to fast track the greening of the environment. He added that given the nature of the faculty, which was environmental, grass was expected to be green and properly landscaped.

Professor Yakubu also said that some blocks within the faculty were grappling with lack of water because the borehole in the block had stopped working. He therefore solicited for another borehole to solve the problem of shortage of water.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Abbas in his response welcomed the Dean and his team. He said the non-availability of funds had hindered the request that was made by the faculty earlier in the year. He therefore pleaded with them to bear with the University Management.

He said when the University became buoyant enough, the greening of the faculty environment would be done and that an industrial borehole would be provided to get high yield of water.

Professor Abbas commended them for a great job. He said that, Earth and Environmental Science courses were the trend globally. He, therefore, promised to continue to support the faculty at all time.
