The Vice-Chancellor made the assertion when he received members of the Medical and Dental Consultants Association of Nigeria (MDCAN), Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital (AKTH) branch in his office on

According to Dr. Salihu, the AKTH branch of the Medical and Dental Consultants Association of Nigeria (MDCAN) had over 200 members with over 90% of them as lecturers.

Dr. Salihu said, “Our graduates compete favourably with other doctors within and outside Nigeria.”

BUK Commences Drug Manufacturing

Bayero University Kano through its Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences is set to establish a drug manufacturing unit and a drug information unit as part of its mission to make the faculty more innovative and self-

reliant.

This was disclosed by the Dean of Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Dr. Sani Malami, on Thursday, 10th June, 2021, while submitting the draft report on the establishment of the drug manufacturing unit to the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, in his office.

Dr. Malami, who acknowledged the support of the University towards improving the standards of the faculty, thanked the Vice Chancellor for approving the building of an additional lecture hall in the faculty. He noted that recently, the faculty successfully trained foreign students in collaboration with the Pharmaceutical Council of Nigeria (PCN).

In his comment, Professor, Lawan Alhassan Bichi said that the major challenge facing the faculty was lack of adequate teaching staff. He further appealed to the Management to wave some of the constraints by recruiting graduate assistants to the faculty.

Responding, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir

Adamu Abbas, assured the faculty of full implementation of the report as soon as possible.

“On this report, we are on course and we will respond to it accordingly,” he said.

With regards to staffing, the Vice Chancellor said many departments lacked teaching staff but the major challenge of employment was getting approval from

federal agencies. He assured the faculty of his full support and consideration of their demands.

“We will get statistics of all staff needed, we have also secured a facility from the budget for the faculty to construct a new lecture hall,” he disclosed.

When established, the drug manufacturing unit will be the first of its kind in northern Nigerian universities.

VC Impressed with Premiere Documentary on Covid-19 Pandemic

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, was impressed with the premiere documentary on the Covid-19 pandemic showcased at the Faculty of Communication on Thursday, 10th June, 2021. He said it had really manifested the public health crisis facing Nigeria and called for policy makers to re-strategize and revamp the public health sector.

The Vice Chancellor, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Research and Development, Professor Abdullahi Sule-Kano, decried the government's policies of tackling the health sector crisis, noting that the current realities required a different approach rather than borrowing a leaf from the capitalist system to address our peculiarities.

The Vice Chancellor commended the producers of the film led by Kadaria Ahmed, the Chief Executive Officer of Daria Media and Femi Odugbami, the director of the documentary.

Speaking at the occasion, the Governor of the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN), Godwin Emefiele, restated the CBN's commitment to working with all stakeholders to improve access to finance and credit that would support the development of a viable healthcare infrastructure in the country.

Emefiele said the apex bank was not unmindful of the strong linkage between healthcare and economic growth, as evidenced by the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on Nigeria and indeed on the world.

“In order to prevent future health crises that could have spillover effects on our economy, it is important that the public and private sector work to improve access to healthcare, support research and development in the health sector and find ways to disseminate useful information on healthcare to the general public,” said Emefiele.

Kadaria Ahmed said, “One of the things that people are not talking about and which this documentary has covered is that some of the present challenges that we currently face are as the result of this pandemic. When you deal with pandemic, you are dealing with three things; health crisis, economic crisis and social/public and security crisis”.

The event also featured a panel discussion moderated by Kadaria and had in the panel the Executive Director, Kano State Primary Healthcare Management Board, Dr Tijjani

Hussain, the Director, Centre for Infectious Diseases Research, BUK, Professor Isa Sadik Abubakar and the Coordinator of Reproductive Health in the state, Dr Aisha Faruk.

While administering the oath of allegiance, the Registrar of NIAS, Professor Eustance Iyayi, tasked the graduands to exhibit a high sense of professionalism in the conduct of their affairs and informed them to use their expertise to create sources of income since the government could not provide employment to all

graduates.

He said NIAS had developed regulations that would help animal scientists to get job opportunities in downstream poultry farms and feed mills, saying that a new public sector scheme of service had been reviewed in that to be employed in animal husbandry, one must acquire a degree in Animal Science.

The representative of the Vice Chancellor of Federal University of Agriculture, Makurdi, Professor A.R

Kimbir, said animals were part of our sustenance, as “we consume them, admire them, care for them, fear and love them, as well as depend on them.” He said because of their importance, we also study them and apply what we learn to improve their lives and enhance their roles in our lives.

Prof Kimbir told the inductees that as they went into the wider world using what they learnt from the various institutions they attended, “remember that you have a role to play in the lives of humanity and in the welfare of the animal under your care.”

Dane Francis from Federal University of Agriculture, Makurdi, who spoke on behalf of the inductees, expressed appreciation to NIAS for inducting them into the institute and vowed to be more relevant in the scheme of things in the economic development of the country.

Earlier in his welcome remarks, the Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, who was represented by the Director of Academic Planning, Professor Haruna Musa, congratulated the inductees for passing the examination of NIAS and hailed the institute's doggedness in enshrining professional practice of animal science.
