# Presidential Visitation Panel Impressed with CDA's 89 PhDs Enrollment

The Presidential Visitation Panel deployed to Bayero University has been overwhelmed by the Centre of Dryland Agriculture's massive transformation and achievements in recent times and believed that the Centre deserved commendation as an exemplified true Africa centre of excellence.

The Visitation Panel was particularly impressed with the rising profile of CDA in Africa with the enrollment of 87 PhDs and over 300 MScs and with students from 13 African countries in just five years.

The Chairman of the Visitation Panel, Professor Femi Otunbajo, spoke on behalf of other members of the panel when they interacted with the management and staff of CDA on Friday, 23<sup>rd</sup> May, 2021.

According to the Chairman, "we have been hearing and reading about this Africa centre of excellence and it becomes paramount for this panel to come and see the massive projects put in place."

Prof Otunbajo took time to shower encomiums on the enrollment of 89 PhD candidates from West and Central Africa, saying that the objective of establishing CDA among other things to address the manpower development in Africa had been well achieved.

The panel also commended the CDA for sustaining the centre in spite of the challenges of accessing fund and expressed a high level of satisfaction with the centre's real commitment to transform the dryland into rich agricultural resources.

Earlier in his remarks, the Director CDA, Professor Jibrin

Mohammed Jibrin, told the panel that the centre, which was established in 2012, had recorded massive transformations in the area of research, teaching and collaboration as it had collaborated with many institutions and industries around the world.

According to him, the centre competed and won a World Bank grant to become an African Centre of Excellence and recently it was among the few selected among the Africa Centres of Excellence for Development Impact.

He said through the CDA programme, Bayero University was selected by PASET as one of seven African universities to host PASET doctoral scholars and RSIF research and innovation activities in PhD Natural Resource Management and Climate Change. He added that 144 universities applied, but BUK was among the only 7 selected to host the PASET programme.

Prof. Jibrin further explained that the CDA had greatly assisted over 20,000 farmers in terms of improving their yields and reducing the cost of their production. The centre also promoted various varieties of crops such as groundnut and cowpea, and farmers had significantly adopted them.

"The CDA has developed a fertilizer recommended tool which as of last year was extended to more than 20,000 farmers," said the Director CDA, Prof Jibrin.

The members of the panel were taken round the CDA facilities, including the multi-purpose laboratories, Training and Research Farm and Tissue Culture Laboratory.

# "BUK One of the Most Peaceful Universities in Nigeria," Says Governor Ganduje

Earlier, the Chairman of the Presidential Visitation Panel, Professor Femi Otubanjo, said they were at Government House as part of the interaction with various stakeholders to find out the relationship between the University and host communities.

He noted that they were assigned to visit Bayero University with a view to finding out how the institution was being governed, the challenges they were facing, how it has been managed and how best it could serve the purpose for which it was established, among other things.

He expressed delight at the cordial relationship between the host Kano State government and the Management of Bayero University, which is worthy of emulation.

## ... Calls for Review of Curriculum to Prioritize Technical Education

The Governor of Kano State, Dr. Abdullahi Umar Ganduje has suggested for a review of university curriculum with a view to giving priority to technical education, explaining that, "the number of unemployed graduates is alarming which calls for a serious rethink."

"Our emphasis should be shifted to technical education so as to address the lingering unemployment among the teeming graduates," said the Governor.

The Governor spoke in his office on Saturday, 29<sup>th</sup> May, 2021 while receiving members of the BUK Presidential Visitation Panel, saying that, "education is not only about gaining employment, but rather to increase the level of one's power of reasoning."

Dr. Ganduje argued that the inclusion of technical education in our curriculum development, especially at tertiary institutions, would go a long way in inculcating the attitude of self-reliance amongst teeming youth.

Dr. Ganduje said that most developed nations gave priority attention to technical and entrepreneurial studies, making their youth self-reliant rather than looking for white colour jobs.

The Governor equally promised to intervene and make sure that the existing cordial relationship between Bayero

University and host communities become stronger and cordial. In particular, he said "with regards the issue of allocating land to those villagers around the University, the State government would definitely look into that with a view to finding amicable solution. "Even for the sake of

improving security around the university, something concrete and effective will be done," the Governor assured.

In his speech, the Chairman of the Panel, Prof Otubanjo Olufemi, disclosed that "your Excellency, we are seeking for your support to kindly intervene as some villagers

surrounding the university are encroaching the university's land. We urge you to relocate them to other places on new Ring Road or any other area you deem fit, Sir. Also in the area of the issuance of Certificate of Occupancy," he appealed.
