



49th Professorial Lecture: “Optimal use of Local Anaesthetic Agents Containing Epinephrine has no Effect on Blood Pressure” ... Says Professor Bamgbose

Clinical study has indicated that optimal application of local anaesthetic agents containing epinephrine during minor oral surgical procedures does not have any effect on blood pressure or pulse rate, a Professor of Oral and Maxillofacial Radiology, from the Faculty of Dentistry, Professor Babatunde Olamide Bamgbose, has revealed.

Presenting the 49th Professorial Inaugural Lecture on Thursday, 9th September, 2021 at the Convocation Arena, New Campus, titled *Matrix of the Knowledge of Light and Knife: The Journey of a Maxillofacial Surgeon into Imaging*, Professor Bamgbose noted that despite the agents therein, research had unearthed the safety of the agents explaining that there was no nexus between increase in blood pressure of the patients and the optimal use of local anaesthetic agents during the minor oral surgery.”

According to him, vasoconstrictors (epinephrine) were mainly used during minor oral surgical procedures as part of the composition of local anaesthetic agents to improve the biological properties of the solution.

“Epinephrine is the most frequently used and its desirable properties include haemostasis, increased depth and duration of anaesthesia, decreased systemic absorption and reduced toxicity. Our study was to assess the effect of vasoconstrictor contained in local anaesthetics on arterial blood pressure during minor oral surgical procedures,” he declared.

He disclosed that human subjects recruited into the study were divided into two groups and one group was treated

using 2% lignocaine HCL with 1:80:0000 epinephrine and while the other was treated using 2% plain lignocaine (without epinephrine).

After a careful analysis of the study, they concluded that optimal use of local anaesthetic agents containing epinephrine does not cause a statistically significant increase in blood pressure of pulse rate,” he declared.

Professor Bamgbose who is the first person to assume the rank of Professor of Oral Maxillofacial Radiology in Nigeria and the entire West African region, also explained his decision to shift his speciality from Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery to Oral and Maxillofacial Radiology.

He described Oral Maxillofacial Radiology as the newest specialty in Dentistry, pointing out that Bayero University is the only Institution in the entire Nigeria and, by extension, the West African Health Community, with a full accreditation to commence postgraduate training in that respect.

In his remarks, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, said the University Management is making effort to ensure that it clears all the outstanding Inaugural Lectures.

Professor Abbas while commending the determination and commitment of the Inaugural Lecture Committee, said his administration will place premium in the regular hosting of such lecture, pointing out that the speed is very encouraging so far.

According to the Chief Operating Officer, despite the challenges ranging from fragmented internal markets, poor linkages, unconnected trader or processor relation and unchecked middlemen, Nigeria strived to maintain its status among the top ten exporters of sesame seed.

The death has occurred of Professor Wahab Larin Olagoke Jimoh. He died on Sunday, 12th September, 2021 after a protracted illness.

Aged 68, the late Jimoh was a Professor of Analytical Chemistry in the Department of Pure and Industrial Chemistry.

A statement signed by the Head, Department of Pure and Industrial Chemistry, Dr. Ibrahim Tajo Siraj, said the deceased had already been buried according to Islamic rites.

He was a onetime Dean of the Faculty of Science and Head, Department of Chemistry.

Meanwhile, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas has condolled the families of the deceased, describing late WLO Jimoh as God fearing and kind hearted gentleman who put in his best to the progress of the university.

"Indeed, we lost a great man who dedicated all his life in teaching and research. The likes of Professor Jimoh are very scarce nowadays. He died at a time when his services are needed the most. We pray to Almighty Allah to grant him Jannatul Firdaus and may the family have the fortitude to bear the irreparable loss.

In a similar development, another senior lecturer, Dr. Abdullahi Uba Ahmad of the department Biological Sciences died.

He died on Monday, 13th September, 2021 as a result of ghastly motor accident along Kano-Gumel road.

According to a statement from the head, Department of Biological Sciences, Dr. Tijjani Imam said, late Uba Ahmed was until his death, the level 400 Coordinator for B. Sc Applied Biology and a member of the Postgraduate Board.

He has since been buried in his hometown Garki in Jigawa state.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas on behalf of the Council, Management and entire members of the University community expressed his condolences to the members of his immediate family and prayed Allah to grant him Jannatul Firdaus.

Similarly, a senior non-teaching staff in the Directorate of Security, Umar Salisu popularly know as Lazy died after a protracted illness, so also a retired staff, Madam Essiet, who famously was a former staff in Information and Publication, as well as Department of Biochemistry.
