Islamic Civilisation Instrumental to Socio-economic Advancement of Europe, America, Others ... Says Dr. Bashir Umar

he current socio-economic, political and technological advancement witnessed in the developed nations of Europe and America were the direct manifestation of the positive impact of the concept and values of the Islamic Civilization of ancient times, a renowned Islamic scholar and university don, Dr. Bashir Aliyu Umar, has said.

Delivering a paper, titled "Islamic Civilisation: Concepts, Sources and Manifestations" at the 4th Public Lecture organized by the Centre for Islamic Civilisation and Inter faith Dialogue (CICID), on Wednesday, 7th April, 2021 at the Convocation Arena, he noted that the world would be a better place to live if Muslim nations and other societies would reinvigorate and imbibe those values of Islamic civilization.

According to him, Islamic Civilization has given societies and communities a sense of cultural identity and a sense of belonging to members of the respective societies, which influenced their modernization, socialization and economic as well as technological transformation over the years.

"It is interesting to note that Islamic Civilisation transmitted classic knowledge from the east to the west thereby institutionalizing the culture of knowledge in the Centre the global arena," he posited, pointing out that all the university, Fancient philosophers derived their inspiration from Civilisation.

Islamic scholars since time immemorial," he asserted. Dr. Bashir Umar, who was the pioneer Director of the Centre for Islamic Civilisation and Interfaith Dialogue (CICID), particularly argued that the development of Europe, America, Chinese, Japanese Russia and other superpowers in the field of Agriculture, Science, Technology, economy and other aspects of human development, was only possible through their contact with Islamic Civilisation, and Muslim scholars.

He concluded that the world would prosper and be transformed beyond imagination if Muslim nations would return to their lost values of Islamic Civilisation of yester years.

Earlier, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, in his opening remarks commended the Centre for organizing the lecture series, which he said was a better way of promoting scholarship. He assured of his readiness to support such intellectual gathering, which was one sure way of developing education sector.

Professor Abbas, who expressed delight at the activeness of the Centre, which he said was up to the expectation, as it was excellently serving the purpose for which it was established, noted that the Centre had been making the university proud.

In his welcome remarks, the Director of the Centre, Professor Salisu Shehu, said the lecture was in line of the philosophy and vision of promoting intellectualism and scholarship. He said the proceedings of the lecture would be published in a book form.

He expressed gratitude to the management of the university for the support and encouragement it had been rendering, which made it possible to sustain the lecture series.

Presidential Visitation Panel Arrives BUK

The Presidential Visitation Panel to Bayero University has started its assignment under the Chairmanship of Professor Femi Otubanjo.

In the exercise of the powers of the President, Commanderin-Chief of the Armed Forces as the Visitor to Federal universities, President Muhammadu Buhari, GCFR, appointed a 7-member Visitation Panel to Bayero University, Kano to undertake a comprehensive review of the activities of the university for the periods 2011-2015 and 2016-2020.

Consequently, MHJDS provides a platform for researchers, social scientists and other academics to disseminate knowledge about the democratization process in Nigeria specifically and democracy in general. The journal is peer reviewed and published annually.

Articles for publication should be on the following areas but not strictly limited to them: Conceptual and Theoretical Issues in Democracy, Democratization Process in Nigeria, Political Parties, Political Party Finance, Elections, Voting Behaviour, Political Campaign, Human Rights, Civil Society, Political Conflict and Conflict Resolution, Governance, Corruption, Public Policy, Gender, Youth Issues and all other issues related to political economy. However, the Editorial Board reserves the right to reject or return for revision any material submitted on the grounds of inappropriate subject matter, quality, length, or because of non-conformity with the submission guidelines.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Articles to be considered for publication in MHJDS must conform to these guidelines:

1) The manuscript must be typed, double-spaced and should not exceed 20 pages including references.

2) All references in the manuscript must agree with the most recent APA style.

- 3) An abstract of not more than 150 words, should accompany all submissions. The title of the article (but not the author's name) should be repeated just before the text of the abstract. Author's brief profile of not more than 50 words including name, position/rank, institutional affiliation, areas of research/expertise should accompany the manuscript. Margins throughout the manuscript (top, bottom, and both sides) must be at least 1 inch (2.5 centimeters) and the Times New Roman font is to be used throughout the manuscript. The font size must be 12. All pages of the manuscript should be numbered consecutively.
- 4) Articles submitted to MHJDS must be structured to include the following sections: title, abstract, introduction and literature review. Other sections are: methodology, results (for empirical papers only), conclusion, references and appendices (if applicable).5) All tables and figures should be appropriately and consecutively numbered. The titles should be placed on top of each

table or figure.

6) Articles submitted to MHJDS must not simultaneously be under consideration for publication by any other publishing outfit and may not have already been published elsewhere.

7) A copy of the manuscript must be submitted to the Managing Editor of MHJDS electronically in form of Microsoft

8) Papers submitted after the submission deadline of an issue are automatically rolled over to the next issue.
