## VC Launches On-Campus Students Work Scheme ...Skills Acquisition Center Underway

In his determined effort to assist students, promote their welfare and rid them of financial difficulties, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, has initiated a scheme for on-campus part-time job in which one hundred and twenty five students were engaged in the first instance. The aim is to help the students to earn legitimate income by rendering some services to the University.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Abbas, who launched the scheme on Friday, 3rd December, 2021, said it was the first of its kind introduced in the University as part of his promise to improve the welfare of students.

He said it was a special day for him to fulfill one of the promises he made of improving the welfare of students, noting that the essence was to make life comfortable for students.

According to the Vice Chancellor, the students would be engaged in various assignments, such as the monitoring and supervision of University's facilities and surveillance to ensure secure environment and cleanliness, as well as other jobs that may arise.

He happily said that each student would earn N15,000 monthly subject to being cleared by his supervisor after

meeting the necessary requirements.

Prof Abbas added that the employed students would be proud of the work because they were going to earn legitimate money by rendering services to the University. He said the day was also special to the University.

The Vice Chancellor, however, drew the attention of the engaged students that they were the pioneer beneficiaries of the scheme. As such, they should do whatever they could to protect the interest of the University.

The Vice Chancellor also disclosed that plans were underway to establish students skills acquisition center in the university. He said when fully operational, the center will be teaching volunteer students to acquire some entrepreneurial skills so as to make them self-reliant upon graduation.

"The center which will be free of charge to any interested student of the University would allow participants to learn some trades such as tailoring, make-up as well as beauty saloon business and other practical skills which will go a long way to help the students to be self reliant after graduation," said the Vice Chancellor.

In his remarks, the Deputy Vice Chancellor, Management Services, Professor Mahmoud Umar Sani, while giving the background of the scheme, said it was the initiative of the Vice Chancellor, who felt that the University should introduce a scheme that would ease the financial hardship of students with part-time jobs. This, he said, was in recognition of the unfavorable economic status of some of the students which made it difficult for them to cope.

Professor Sani explained that the objectives were to create a symbiotic relationship between students and the University, where part-time jobs would be offered to interested students for mutual benefits. This would improve on the already existing relationship between students and the University, he added.

## Mambayya House to Introduce Certificate Programme on Leadership – VC, Prof. Abbas

Preparations have reached advanced stage by the Aminu Kano Centre for Democratic Studies, Mambayya House to introduce a new certificate programme on leadership and democratic governance, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, has disclosed.

The Vice Chancellor was speaking on Saturday, December 4, 2021 during a public lecture, titled: **Democracy, Good Governance and the Question of National Integration in Nigeria**, organized to mark the 21<sup>st</sup> Anniversary of Mambayya House.

He explained that the programme would focus on political party administration, election management and administration, lawmaking and legislative process.

According to him, the short training was designed to develop the capacity and skills of Nigerian political leaders, public office holders, election managers, and political party executives, among others.

He said that Bayero University was proud of Mambayya House, considering the numerous achievements it recorded in the areas of research and training in the past two decades.

In his remarks, the Director, Mambayya House, Prof. Isma'ila M. Zango, said the Aminu Kano Centre for Democratic Studies, came into being in November 2000 as a research and training unit of Bayero University, Kano, in the premises vacated by the defunct Centre for Democratic Studies (CDS), which was established by the Federal

## **Mambayya House 21<sup>st</sup> Anniversary Lecture: We Must Rebuild Our Social Policy to Address our Discontents – Gov. Fayemi**

The Chairman of the Nigerian Governors Forum and Governor of Ekiti State, Dr. John Kayode Fayemi, has expressed worry over what he called the myriads of discord and discontent afflicting the Nation's social psyche, that something urgent must be done collectively to address the menace.

Delivering a public lecture, titled *Democracy, Good Governance And The Question Of National Integration In Nigeria*, on Saturday, December 4, 2021, at the Mambayya House, the Governor, who was the Guest Speaker, said to get to the root of the discontent with a view to addressing them, he suggested the need for a new Sawaba Declaration, which was aimed at rebuilding the nation's social policy.

"If we do this, we will achieve a considerable level of headway for our nation" he remarked.

He said that he was delighted to be part of the history and deliver a lecture to commemorate the 21st anniversary of Mambayya House, which he said was directly connected to the person whose memory and legacy it partly served to preserve and keep alive.

Governor Fayemi described Mallam Aminu Kano as a man who carved a niche for himself as the pre-eminent voice and champion of the *Talakawa*. He stood shoulder to shoulder with the likes of Kwame Nkrumah, Ahmed Sekou Toure, Ahmed Ben Bella and other icons of African liberation from the shackles of colonial rule.

On his part, the Chairman of the occasion, the Jigawa State Governor, Governor Muhammadu Badaru Abubakar, said, as Nigerians, we should all be proud of our democracy. He argued that all democracies in the world had their own challenges.

According to him, the time had come to start changing the mindsets of our citizens and was optimistic that Mambayya

House was doing remarkably well in that direction.

Earlier in his welcome address, the Vice Chancellor, Professor, Sagir Adamu Abbas, said the centre since its inception had carried out and applied researches on aspects of democracy and good governance, such as social justice, human rights, anti-corruption, democratic institutions and electoral process. # CDA One of BUK's Success Stories – VC

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, has admitted that the Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) was one of the success stories of the University, commending the Director, Professor Jibrin M. Jibrin, and the team members for working hard to ensure that the Centre became one of the best Africa Centres of Excellence.

The Vice Chancellor was speaking on Monday, 22<sup>nd</sup> November, 2021 when he received Ambassador Rabiun Dagari, Mni, the Director General, Directorate of Technical Cooperation in Africa (DTCA), who paid him a courtesy as part of a follow up on previous contact his directorate had with the CDA for a possible collaboration with the University.

The VC stated that the BUK was open to any collaboration with the Directorate of Technical Cooperation in Africa DTCA, saying that the CDA had been undergoing research on agriculture that impacted positively on the farmers for quite some time. “You are therefore at the right place for collaboration,” he said.

The VC added that CDA had the expertise and experience with research at all levels having recorded successes in its collaboration with local national and international partners. He further explained that “BUK is reaching out to the President of African Development Bank (ADB) Akinwumi Adesina to offer a convocation lecture at the upcoming convocation ceremony, which will be a window for further partnership with the bank. The CDA will be pivotal in helping the directorate replenish its funding.”

According to Ambassador Rabiun Dagari, his directorate's emphasis was on bringing out research in agriculture to benefit the farmers.

The Nigerian Technical Corporation Fund, he said, was created with a grant of \$25 million from the Nigerian Trust

Fund in African Development Bank, which was for 10 years. “The funds have lasted more than the 10yrs and are at a point of replenishment. The Director is working all the possible links to push for the replenishment of even a fraction of the original fund,” he explained.

The director noted that in terms of agricultural project, Nigeria still spent a lot of money importing food, as no country could develop without food sufficiency. He said

projects at CDA were of special interests to the directorate. Ambassador Dagari said that the directorate wanted to support the introduction of new technology like early maturing crops and drought resistant seeds. “Climate change is making agriculture difficult, compounding the problems of food sufficiency in the Sahel in particular. This is the main reason we are here. Hopefully a beginning of a fruitful collaboration between DTCA and BUK particularly the CDA”, he said.

- 2) The article **should not be more than twenty-five (25) pages of 4000 – 7000 words in length.** It should be typed with 1.15 line spacing option, with a margin of 1.25 and 1.13 inches on the left and right sides, respectively. The font type to be used is “Arial” with font size “14” for headings and size “12” for the body of the article.

- 3) The manuscript must be accompanied with a letter of submission written in English. Submission of a paper is assumed to imply that its contents represent original unpublished work and is not under consideration elsewhere for publication.

- 4) There is neither a submission charge nor page fee. The complete names and address (postal and email) of the author or lead author in the case of co-authored papers should be clearly indicated. **Please note that**

- papers with more than two co-authors will not be accepted.**
- 5) Papers may be rejected, accepted or returned for specified revisions.
  - 6) All submitted manuscripts are referred to an Editorial Board comprising of an in-house editorial committee and external referees for peer-review of the paper. All comments by the referees will be sent to the author(s), including a decision of the Editorial Board to publish or not to publish the paper.
  - 7) The purpose and scope of the article should be clearly stated in an abstract summarizing the article's essential findings. The abstract should be typed on a separate page and should be **italicized and not more than 100 words in length**. In addition, the JEL classification code(s) as well as keywords should be clearly indicated on the abstract page.
  - 8) The author's institutional affiliation and necessary background information on the article should appear at the foot of the first page. Footnote to the text should be listed at the end, followed by the list of references.
  - 9) The honorarium for authors of accepted papers in the Bullion is N80,000 per paper and for reviewers N30,000 per paper.
  - 10) References for quotations or statements should be in parentheses in the text, not as notes. E.g. Mordi (2010:20) or Mu'azu (2014). Where more than two authors are involved, cite senior author and use et al., for example, Johnson et al. (1988).
  - 11) Citations listed under the reference sections must begin on a new page. All entries must be typed double-spaced, listed alphabetically by last name of senior author and chronologically for two or more articles by the same author. The typed layout must conform to the Havard style, as follows:

Mordi, C.N.O. (2010). "The Nigerian Financial Crisis: Lessons, Prospects and Way Forward", CBN Bullion. Vol. 31 No. 3, July-September, pp.1-10.

Adenuga, A.O. and O. Evbuomwan (2011), "Understanding the Bretton Woods Institutions (BWIs) with particular Reference to the International Monetary Fund (IMF)" CBN Bullion, Vol.35 No. 4, October-December, pp.10-15.

- 12) All tabular materials should be separated from the text in a series of tables numbered consecutively in Arabic numerals preferably in Microsoft Excel. Each table should be typed double-spaced and identified by a short title at the top. Notes for table should be at the bottom of each table, before the source, and marked by lower case superscript letters. Appropriately placed tables should be indicated in the text.
- 13) Diagrams, graphs, charts, etc. must be separated from the text and clearly plotted on a white paper with all axes clearly positioned. They should be inserted appropriately in the text.
- 14) Where mathematical equations and formulae are used, they should be typed clearly, using MathType or Microsoft Equation Editor. The equations should be numbered consecutively in Arabic numerals.
- 15) All submissions should be accompanied with a clear digital soft copy passport size photographs of the author(s).

- Clear and in focus
- In color
- Unaltered by computer software
- At least 600 pixels wide and 750 pixels tall
- At least 50KB and no more than 10MB
- Contain no other objects or people
- Be taken against a plain light-colored background
- Be in clear contrast to the background
- Not have 'red eye'

***In your photo you must:***

- Be facing forwards and looking straight at the camera
- Have a plain expression and your mouth closed
- Have your eyes open and visible
- Not have anything covering your face
- Not have any shadows on your face or behind you

Do not wear sunglasses or tinted glasses. You can wear other glasses if you need to, but your eyes must be visible without any glare or reflection.
