



## BUK Introduces On-Campus Student Job Scheme

The Management of Bayero University has introduced on-Campus Students job scheme, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, who disclosed this, said the new project will kick off from the current academic session.

Speaking on Monday, 15th November, 2021 during the flagging off of this year's Campus Fire Safety Week organized by the Federal Fire Service, Kano State Command which took place at the Convocation Arena at the New Campus, the Vice Chancellor explained that under the project, students would be engaged to serve as cleaners and other menial jobs in the hostel and other academic areas of the university.

According to him a total of 250 students would be engaged for the scheme in the two semesters, pointing out that in the first semester 125 students would be recruited and the same number would serve in the second semester.

Professor Abbas while giving further explanation on the concept, noted that in addition to ensuring cleanliness of the university environment as well as providing security, the engaged students will be financially supported by getting stipends for the services rendered.

“The Management has concluded arrangement to provide job opportunity to students on campus. These opportunities will allow the participants to earn some token amount every month and payment will be made forth nightly or weekly. The programme will employ 125 students per semester and will last throughout the year,” said the Vice Chancellor.

He revealed that the on-Campus job scheme will utilize the students in the areas of picking litters waste, cutting

grasses, and running errand on non-sensitive information/documents as well as proving security watch in some places within the University campuses.

The scheme, which was the initiative of Professor Sagir Abbas, saw Bayero University as the first institution to introduce it at least from this part of the country. Already, many students were enthusiastic to participate in the scheme.

He disclosed that, this exercise had been the norm in most of the developed nations and therefore, as part of the policy of finding solace to most of the problems facing the university, particularly, in view of the lean resources, it becomes imperative to devise a means of cutting cost against employment of full time employees,” he said.

Turning to the issue of students' welfare, the Vice Chancellor reaffirmed the commitment of the Management to provide an enabling environment conducive for learning and teaching. Already, he said the Management had acquired a 500KVA generator to be dedicated to student's hostel alone with a view to improving electricity supply in the students' hall of residences.'

Professor Abbas urged the students to remain focused, law abiding and be good ambassadors of their parents so as to be responsible citizens upon graduation, noting that the Management would not take it lightly with anyone found wanting in character, saying degrees are being awarded based on twin principles of character and learning.

Highlight of the event was the presentation of an award of Ambassador of Fire Safety on the Vice Chancellor along with nine other prominent citizens in Kano State by the Command.

Malam Bala Abadullahi joined Bayero University, Kano in 2012. In 2013, he was posted to the Information and Publication Division under the Directorate of Public Affairs, Vice Chancellor's Office where he served until 2021 as Senior Assistant Registrar, Publication.

The new Publication Secretary holds a Master's Degree in Communication Studies.

Creating an enabling environment in the University community is a collective responsibility by ensuring the provision of the policy to safeguard gender-based violence is strictly adhered to, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, has announced.

The Vice Chancellor, Prof. Sagir Adamu Abbas, who was represented by Deputy Director, Academic Planning Unit,

Dr. Yusuf Garba reiterated this at the launching of a whistle blowing and a safeguarding policy towards strengthening protection against gender-based violence on campus. The event was organized by BUK Centre for Gender Studies in collaboration with the Yar'adua Foundation and Women's Rights Advancement and Protection Alternative (WRAPA) on Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> November, 2021 at Musa Abdullahi Auditorium.

He said the University was an academic and educational institution that had clear rules and regulations with the aim of providing a safe, nondiscriminatory and non-exploitative environment free from harassment and sexual assault.

According to him, the University was committed to creating and maintaining a community where all persons

near future.

“Indeed, Alhaji Sani Dangote is a great man who was always eager and enthusiastic to make people happy especially the less privileged members in the society. We really loss a man of God and we pray Almighty Allah to give you the solace and the fortitude to bear the irreparable loss,” said Professor Sagir.

In her response, the mother, Hajiya Mariya Sunusi Dangote thanked the Management of the University for the visit and pray Allah to accept all the prayers for the repose of the soul of her son and many others that died.

On the entourage during the visit include the Deputy Vice Chancellors Academic, Professor Sani Muhammad Gumel, Management Services, Professor Mahmoud Umar Sani, the Registrar, Malam Jamil Ahmad Salim, University Bursar, Dr. Muhammad Bello Suleiman, as well as Director VC's office, Malam Sherif Ahmed and Lamara

who participated in its academic programme and other related activities could work, learn and live together in an atmosphere devoid from all forms of abuse or harassment.

Prof Abbas disclosed that the University would be establishing a safeguarding policy committee with a minimum membership of three females across units, such as the Registry, Student Affairs, and the legal unit, the Center for Gender Studies, Student Union Government, Health Services and the Security Division.

The Secretary-General of WRAPA, Hajia Saudatu Mahdi, in her opening remarks disclosed that BUK was the first University where the launching took place. She, therefore, commended Prof Abbas for his commitment and support.

She said gender-based violation was not limited only to females but that happened to vulnerable people irrespective of their gender. She said structural arrangement should be put in place to prevent it from happening.

According to her, GBV survivors needed to get justice by taking steps, such as validating accusation and establishing a standard procedure but the right to fair hearing was meticulous and difficult, which made perpetrators get away without being punished. She, therefore, advised relevant agencies to design a practicable intervention that would enhance the capacity of victims to seek redress.

According to Kemi Okeyondo of the Shehu Musa Yar'adua Foundation (SMYF), the Gender Justice Policy was an initiative designed to address the negative spotlight of sex for grade in tertiary institutions, which had tainted University degrees, most especially of female students.

She said the policy was an initiative that would trickle down to primary and secondary schools, adding that it would bring about empowerment, professionalism, partnership and accountability.

The Deputy Director Outreach and Publication of CDA, Prof. Amina Mustapha, in her overview explained that anyone could be a victim of gender-based violence, adding that BUK had a mechanism in place to report any form of violence and that the launching was purposely to create awareness.

She said the University had a duty to protect everyone within its environment by creating an enabling learning and working environment so as to boost the morale of staff and students.

## VC Commends NCRRD for Instituting Courses for the Advancement of Teaching Reading in Nigeria

The Nigeria Centre for Reading, Research and Development (NCRRD) in Bayero University, Kano, has provided the opportunity for academic fellows of the centre to receive advanced training on research and the teaching of reading in the Florida State University, so as to enable the Centre to its mandate, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Sagir Adamu Abbas has disclosed.

The Vice Chancellor was speaking at the 3<sup>rd</sup> National Conference on Children's Books and the Teaching of Early Grade Reading in Nigeria, with the theme: “**Children's Books as Tools for the Effective Teaching of Reading Skills in the Early Grade in Nigeria**”, which was organized by the Centre on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> November, 2021, at Dangote Business School Auditorium.

He said the Centre which came to light as a result of the MOU between BUK and Florida State University, Tallahassee ended in June 2020 and that the University management is ready to fully support the operation of the Centre.

The Centre according to him had presented a book of collected essays titled: “**Issues in the Teaching of Early Grade Reading in Nigeria**” which was published with 5,000 copies distributed by the Universal Basic Education Commission. Abuja.

The Director, Prof. Talatu Musa Garba in her remarks thanked and appreciated all those that came from far and near to participate in the Conference. She disclosed that the Centre has concluded arrangement to publish Nigeria Journal of teaching.

She said a Library which was established by the Florida State University needed more books to boost its collection. She, therefore, appealed to relevant bodies and agencies to support the centre in that regard.

Professor Ramlatu Jibir Daura, of the Departments of Arts and Social Science in Education, ABU Zaria in her key note address, titled “**Children's Books As the Foundation for the Development of Effective Reading Skills At the Early Grade Level**” said, reading is the act of understanding a written text; a mental process that involves understanding symbols in order to arrive at a meaning; a complex activity that involves both perception and thought.

The Director Centre for Gender Studies, Dr. Suwaiba Ahmad Sa'id, in her closing remarks thanked all for witnessing the landmark achievement.

She explained that the policy was not new because the University had a mechanism in place that was not only proactive but preventive to guide against any form of harassment and assault. She, therefore, gave assurance that the University would continue to collaborate and partner with any agency to curb the menace of Gender-based violence.

She said the definition of reading has changed to include complex visual and digital media as well as printed materials. She said with the coming of technology into modern life, reading is on electronic display equipment, such as computers, mobile phones or e-reader.

She said technology has not completely discarded reading

and that children need to be taught to become active readers which can only be achieved through reading skills to be taught by early grade learners.

According to Prof. Jibir Daura children need to learn to read early, in order to attain success in school. She said pupils who do not learn to read in the beginning of their education are at a significant disadvantage for the rest of their schooling.

She said reading skills include decoding, phonological and phonics awareness, vocabulary, fluency and comprehension.

Parents and teachers according to Prof. Ramlatu should choose books that are rich in illustration, and photos that help to enhance reading comprehension in the early grade.

She said illustration that provides important background and brings out contextual cues based on what is happening in the story, helps the children to read between the lines and find meaning that may be explicitly stated in the text.

She advised that, publishers who publish books that are meant to teach reading skills to children, should publish the books with repetition that will teach fluency and early grade literature.

## Governor Badaru Pledges to Work with CDA to Develop Agriculture in Jigawa State

Jigawa State Governor, Alhaji Mohammed Badaru Abubakar has expressed his government's willingness to go into partnership with Bayero University in the areas of dryland farming, agroforestry and environmental management in order to boost agricultural productivity and reduce poverty in Jigawa State. According to the Governor, the partnership would include activities aimed at regenerating endangered species of trees, boosting the capacity of farmers in Jigawa to learn modern ways of sustainable farming, as well as providing new technologies that would address the challenges faced by rural farmers. He stated these during an informal visit to the Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA) on Saturday, 13<sup>th</sup> November 2021. The Governor further said his government would work closely with the Centre to boost the farming activities

of women farmers in the state, saying that Jigawa is truly a dry area that required new skills and technologies to boost all year-round farming. "This can be achieved with the partnership of BUK's Centre for Dryland Agriculture. We want this collaboration to start immediately," said the

Governor.

While going round the facilities in the CDA, the Governor said he was overwhelmed with what he saw, noting that he never knew such facilities existed in Nigeria.

"I was amazed with the facilities I have seen and I am optimistic that CDA is the real partner of Jigawa State in terms of boosting agricultural productivity," he stated.

The Governor emphasized that his government is committed to change the narrative of farming by bringing experts and professionals to develop mechanisms of addressing the challenges faced with a view to booting income generation, providing employment and reducing poverty especially among poor and vulnerable. Governor Badaru noted that CDA, along with its partners from the Universities of Leeds and York, are already working in Jigawa State to promote non-irrigated natural regeneration of indigenous trees. He pledged the full support of his government in scaling up the achievements of the project.

Earlier in his remark, the Director, CDA, Professor Jibrin Mohammed Jibrin expressed delight with the visit of the Governor. He said the Centre would be glad to collaborate with agencies in Jigawa State to address the various agricultural and environmental challenges in the state, adding that the CDA and other Departments and units in BUK have state-of-the-art facilities and seasoned experts and professionals that can assist the State.

The Governor, who was accompanied by his Commissioner for Agriculture, had earlier discussed with a team of researchers comprising Professor Sanusi Gaya Mohammed, Dr Aliyu Salisu Barau, Professor Ibrahim Baba Yakubu and Dr Lawan Sani on the immediate priority intervention area for the State.
