Aminu Dantata who spoke yesterday at the launch of a book titled "Kano State Under the Administration of Audu Bako, 1967-1975," written by Dr Aisha Na'ima Shehu of the Department of History, Bayero University, Kano, disclosed that the country had all it takes to grow and prosper in the likes of great nations such as America, England and other super powers, but through orchestrated plan by the super powers in tacit connivance with some disgruntled elements within, these potentialities were frustrated.

According to him, "when the European explorers first came to Nigeria, they met well-organized people with a good system of leadership, trading, education and a well focus citizens and they quickly realized that, if they allow

The business mogul who is in his 90s noted that had the west didn't temper with our system of administration and economic policies of that period, Nigeria, by now would have been in the class of any super power that one can think of in this world.

"At my age and by my status, I am not afraid of anything and I can tell anything to the face of anyone, therefore, I am bold to say that, our economy was deliberately weaken so that, we cannot grow and prosper. Indeed, the colonialists have noticed the potentialities in us, knowing fully that, if they allow us to continue with

our policies at the time they first came, they knew that, they will not stay long as we are going to develop spontaneously, hence, the deliberate policy to cripple our wings of growing," he declared.

He commended leaders such as late Audu Bako, the first Military Governor of Kano State, whom he described as a man of vision, foresight and patriotic.

He noted that had our leaders judiciously managed and utilized our resources, by now, Nigeria would have been a heaven on earth, saying that the natural resources especially in the northern region alone had surpassed all the resources in the other regions put together.






