Idea, Philosophy of University Diminishing - Prof. IBK



n eruidte scholar and Professor of English and European Literature, Professor Ibrahim Bello-Kano, has challenged universities globally to address the fast declining idea of knowledge production and truth, freedom of speech in which universities were established and known for.

Professor IBK said universities had turned into mere signs, structures, logos and buildings rather than true producers of new knowledge and innovation.

He made the remarks at the 3rd Social Sciences Lecture titled "The Treasure-House of Signs: The University as Pastiche" on 25th November, 2021 at Musa Abdullahi Auditorium.

The scholar argued that in the areas of cutting-edge research, universities are no match for the big corporations but merely contribute research assistance and versatile professors.

"Indeed all that these disciplines do these days is repeating, redressing, recycling, and de-deifying well-known models of knowledge in their respective areas," he argued.

He concluded that one way by which University staff and unions could cope with the new, de-constructing vision of the university is to resort to or adopt laughter and to laugh it all off.

In his goodwill message, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Sagir Adamu Abbas, who was represented by the University Librarian, Dr. Musa A. Auyo, lauded the faculty for organizing such important activity and urged other faculties to take a cue.

He described the lecture as unique, adding that the Chairman, the lecturer and the discussant were not from the faculty of social sciences which portrayed professionalism and versatility of the faculty.

Earlier in his welcome address, the Dean of Social

He said the faculty has carefully chosen the distinguished senior professors who are intellectually well-known, Professor IBK and Professor Abdalla Uba Adamu as the lecturer and discussant respectively.

CDA Conducts 7th Industry Lecture Market Price Volatility - By Nura Garba -


USA presented the 7th Centre for Dryland Agriculture which facilitated how farmers indicate their main buyers (CDA) Lecture on Market Linkages and Price Volatility: and sellers and indicate their main suppliers (and buyers). Evidence from Nigerian Grain Market on Tuesday, 16th He said they visited more than 16 markets in Nigeria. November, 2021.

Price volatility, according to him was lower in urban consumer markets because they had more linkages and more mechanisms like storage for price stabilization, as well as several sellers competing in the same market created competition. He added that prices were higher in urban consumer markets given intermediaries' costs and margins.

He said Nigerians should not only concentrate on the high price of consumer goods in the market but should also focus on instability. He said there was a consistent reflection of the structure of the market, which was one of the factors that caused price volatility, saying that the urban consumer market as a result of more resources for storage and processing tended to have low price volatility than the farmer market.

Price volatility was a major issue for food security policy. He noted that initiatives by private and government policies as well as investments in markets would address the challenges.

Dr. Michael Adetayo Olabisi from Michigan University, He explained a new mobile application called KasuwaGo,



He advocated the need for investing information, so that people could know where to get things and at what price.

In his remarks, the Director of the Centre, Professor Jibrin Mohammed Jibrin, who was represented by the Deputy Director of Training, Professor Sanusi Gaya Mohammed said, every month the Centre organized this lecture to invite industries and key private sector members in order to match our research and training with what the private sector needed.

In his keynote address titled: CSOs Participation and **Building Coalition in the Fight Against Corruption**, Ibrahim A. Waiya, the Chairman, Conference of Northern States Civil Society Networks, stated that although civil society organizations have key role to play in the fight against corruption, but are faced with challenges of under-funding, lack of training and capacity building. He said appreciated the effort of Mambayya House and MacArthur Foundation for organizing the training which he said will go a long way in addressing some of these problems.


Do-it-Yourself Adaptation Project: CDA Hosts Pre-Test of Audio-Visual Presentation

He said he would always remain grateful to Bayero



Human Resource: Guidelines for Ph.D Programmes for Non-Teaching Staff

- 1. Staff applying for a Ph.D programme should be on tenure appointment and should be a confirmed staff in the University.
- 2. The staff must have spent at least good five (5) years after confirmation of appointment.
- 3. The Ph.D being pursued should be impactful and 8. Staff pursuing Ph.D programme outside Bayero relevant to his/her duties.
- 4. All applications for Ph.D fellowship must be recommended with justification by the applicant's Head of Department.
- 5. The staff strength of the Department should determine the number to be released for the Ph.D fellowship at a time.
- 6. All Ph.D fellowships should be bonded. The bond

- shall require the staff to serve the University for the same number of years spent on the fellowship.
- 7. All applicants must have at least ten (10) years of service remaining before he/she is due for retirement.
- University, Kano should clearly provide evidence of sponsorship for the programme.
- In the event that the staff wants to leave the University services before discharging the stipulated period of bond, he/she shall refund the expense incurred by the University on his/her fellowship, including salaries and allowances on pro rata bases.
