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Universities January 18th Resumption Date Stands

...Minister of Education, As BUK Directs Staff, Students to Comply

he Minister of Education, Malam Adamu Adamu, has announced that all schools in the country are to re-open for full commencement of academic activities on Monday, 18th January, 2021.

In a statement in Abuja issued on Thursday, January, 14th, 2021 and signed by Mr. Ben Bem Goong, the Director, Press and Public Relations of the Federal Ministry of Education on behalf of the Minister, said after due consultations with various stakeholders and following a hint given by the Presidential Task Force, (PTF) on COVID-19, the January 18th resumption date

of all schools across the country should remain unchanged.

"After extensive consultations with relevant stakeholders, including state governors, commissioners of education, proprietors and heads of institutions, staff unions and students, the consensus of opinion is that the resumption date of 18th January, 2021 should remain," said the statement.

The ministry equally urged institutions to ensure availability of functional health clinics with facilities for isolation and transportation of suspected cases to medical facilities. The schools must also adhere to all other non-pharmaceutical protocols, restrictions and containment measures as may be prescribed/approved by the PTF from time to time.

The Minister, however, said these measures which aimed at ensuring safe reopening of schools for academic activities will be subjected to constant review as it urged teachers, school administrators and



It however, warned that parents and respective institutions must ensure full compliance with COVID-19 protocols including compulsory wearing of face masks by students, teachers and workers in all schools; temperature checks and hand washing facilities at strategic locations in all schools.

The statement also directed that all schools must ensure constant supply of water and sanitizers; enforcement of the maintenance of social distancing and suspension of large gathering such as assembly and visiting days as well as overcrowding, including limitations in class sizes and hostel occupancy.

other stakeholders to ensure strict compliance.

Meanwhile, Bayero University has urged all staff and students to resume unfailingly on Monday 18th January, 2021 in compliance with the directive of the Minister of Education.

In a statement issued by the Registrar, Fatima Binta Mohammed on Friday, 15th January, 2021 said full academic activities will commence on the said date.

The Registrar urged all staff and student to strictly follow the protocols of covid-19 set up by Presidential Task Force on Covid-19 such as observing social distancing, wearing of face masks and washing hands with sanitizer and soap.

SCHOOL RESUMPTION DATE OF 18TH JANUARY 2021 STANDS - MINISTER

Sequel to the hint given during the press briefing by the Presidential Task Force, (PTF) on Covid-19 on Tuesday, 12 January 2021 for the review of the proposed resumption date of 18th January 2021, the Federal Ministry of Education has undertaken a comprehensive appraisal of the situation.

After extensive consultations with relevant stakeholders, including State Governors, Commissioners of Education, Proprietors and heads of institutions, staff unions and students, the consensus of opinion is that the resumption date of 18th January should remain, while parents and respective institutions must ensure full compliance with COVID-19 protocols including:-

- (i) Compulsory wearing of Facemasks by all students, teachers and workers in all schools
- (ii) Temperature checks and hand washing facilities at strategic locations in all schools
- (iii) Ensuring constant supply of water and sanitizers
- (iv) Enforcement of maintenance of social distancing and suspension of large gatherings such as assembly and visiting days.
- (v) Avoiding overcrowding, including limitations in class sizes and hostel occupancy
- (vi) Availability of functional health clinics with facilities for isolation and transportation of suspected cases to medical facilities
- (vii) Adherence to all other non-pharmaceutical protocols, restrictions and containment measures as may be prescribed/approved by the PTF from time to time.

These measures which are to ensure safe reopening of schools for academic activities will be subject to constant review as we urge teachers, school administrators and other stakeholders to ensure strict compliance.

BUK's Non-Teaching Staff Unions Protest Over FG's Non-Compliance with MoU

The Senior Staff Association of Nigerian Universities (SSANU) and Non-Academic Staff Union of Educational Institutions and Organized Labour (NASU) under the aegis of Joint Action Committee (JAC) on Tuesday, 12th January, 2021 protested against federal government's failure to honor a memorandum of understanding reached with the federal government.

Hundreds of non-teaching staff converged in the Senate building of Bayero University chanting various solidarity songs and calling the government to honour its agreement and recent memorandum of understanding signed with the unions.

Chairman of SSANU, Dr. Haruna Aliyu addressed the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas and other Principal Officers that the protest was peaceful and conducted under the directive given by the national Joint Action Committee of the two unions.

He said the JAC had on 8th January, 2021 met in Abuja to review the memorandum of understanding reached and signed with the Federal Government on Tuesday, 20th October, 2020 at the Honourable Minister's Conference Room, Federal Ministry of Labour and Employment.

The issues of the MoU according to the Chairman were inconsistencies in the IPPPS payment; non-payment of earned allowances; non-payment of arrears of minimum wage; delay in renegotiation of FG/NASU and SSANU 2009 agreements and non-payment of retirement benefits of retired members.

Others he said were teaching staff usurping headships of non-teaching units in clear violation of conditions of service and establishment procedures as well as neglect and poor funding of state universities.

"It was only yesterday, that the federal government fulfilled one demand which is constitution of Visitation panels for universities," he said.

In his part, the Chairman of NASU, Comrade Abdullahi Nasiru Rafi, said the non-teaching staff unions would not fold their arms and allow government to play galleries with their demands, noting that if it continues to renege their agreements they have no option than to embark on an indefinite strike action.

He called on SSANU and NASU members to continue to support the struggle in order to emancipate them from the shackles of difficulties put by IPPPIS and other government's unfavorable policies.

The Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Kano, Professor Abbas said non-teaching staff members are critical stakeholders in the University and that their work could not be done by any other staff. He noted that the University Management has taken the welfare of staff members with utmost priority, noting that the management would make sure that SSANU and NASU members are not victimized when it comes to their rights.

"We will definitely protect your interest and ensure that your welfare is assured," the Vice Chancellor said.

University Re-opening: BUK Distributes Covid-19 Prevention Items

In readiness for the resumption of academic activities in Bayero University on Monday, January, 18th 2021, the Management has distributed essential equipment for the COVID-19 preventive protocols to all the faculties, centres and directorates to be mounted at

President Muhammadu Buhari has approved the admission of Professor Aliyu Muazu, the Director,

Centre for Research in Nigerian Languages, Translation and Folklore into the National Institute for Policy and Strategic Studies (NIPSS), Kuru.

NIPSS, Kuru is a high-level institution with the primary objectives of serving as the nation's foremost policy think-tank. It is Nigeria's apex institute for policy research and training. It is a policy formation center for bureaucrats, private sector leaders, Army officers, and medium-rank and senior civil servants, which was founded in 1979.

In a letter of admission addressed to Professor Muazu by Brig. General CFJ Udaya for Director General, said, "President and Commander in Chief of the Armed Forces of the Federal Republic of Nigeria has found you worthy to be admitted into the Senior Executive Course 43 (2021) of Nigeria's apex think tank, the National Institute."

It added that "the Course duration is 10 months and it is expected that it would widen your outlook and perspectives on issues, improve your conceptual capacity, quality of analysis and decision making as well as prepare you for the onerous task of leadership and policy implementation."

NIPSS is the only institute in Nigeria that its admission is endorsed by the President.

Amsal Turnkey, Zoic Construction Limited to Build Students Hostel in BUK

Bayero University in partnership with Amsal Turnkey Projects Limited and Zoic Construction Nigeria Limited will construct new students hostel under the design, build, operate and transfer programme.

At the signing of the agreement on Monday, 4th January, 2021 the Managing Director of Amsal Turnkey, Architect Mukhtar Muhammad, said the project will cost a whopping N10 billion and fully funded by the private companies.

He said the project which has ten blocks of hostels is to be cited at the New Campus and when completed will accommodate about 3,000 students. He said it will not collect anything from the University up to its completion.

Architect Muhammad commended the University Management for the understanding and cooperation, saying the project was part of the deliberate policy.

Responding, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, expressed delight for the project and said the Management is very much concerned about the plight of students to address the shortage of accommodation.

In his vote of thanks, the Head, Department of Estate Management, Dr. Jiril D. Jibril commended the companies for the project which he said will go a long way in supplementing the effort of the University Management in solving hostel accommodation problem faced by the students.
