We pray Almighty Allah to guide, protect and give you the wisdom and strength to discharge your duties, diligently, honourably and most proudly," said Professor Abbas.

Professor Sagir Abbas, while wishing him success in the task ahead, charged the new Vice Chancellor to remain focused as a good ambassador of Bayero University.

Meanwhile the Governor of Adamawa State, Rt Honourable Ahmadu Umaru Fintiri has sent a congratulatory message to Professor Umaru A. Pate on his appointment. The Governor, who expressed joy over the appointment, described it as "well deserved having proven himself as an accomplished academic."

The Governor in a statement signed by his Press Secretary, Humwashi Wonosikou expressed confidence on the ability of the new Vice Chancellor to succeed. "I have no doubt in his competence because Prof. Pate has distinguished himself both at the University of Maiduguri and Bayero University, Kano having previously held various leadership roles.'

It could be recalled that, the Governing Council of the Federal University, Kashere after a successful interview, approved the appointment of Professor Umaru A. Pate as the 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice Chancellor of the University.

A letter of appointment dated 17<sup>th</sup> December, 2020 and signed by Yakubu A. H. Ruba, SAN, Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of the Governing Council said "further to the interaction you had on Thursday, 17<sup>th</sup> December, 2020 with the Selection Board for the appointment of Vice Chancellor of the Federal University of Kashere, in the exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 4 of the Universities (Miscellaneous provisions) Amendment Act, 2003, I write on behalf of the Governing Council to offer you an appointment as substantive Vice Chancellor of the University for a single term of Five (5) years effective from 11<sup>th</sup> February, 2021."

Professor Umaru A. Pate who contested along with 27 other candidates scored 92 % to emerge first. Until his appointment, he was the Dean, School of Post graduate Studies, Bayero University, Kano. The closest runner

up in the contest was Professor Polycarp Emeka Chigbu, a former Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academics), University of Nigeria Nsukka (UNN) with 77.8% and Prof. Santaya Larit Kela also a Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academics) from Federal University, Kashere who came 3<sup>rd</sup> with 75.5%.

While presenting the letter, the Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of the Governing Council, Barrister Yakubu A. H. Ruba, SAN, said the appointment was based on merit and his excellent performance in the preceding exercises including computer based test, oral interaction and other procedural.

He urged him to justify the confidence reposed in him by working diligently to develop the University and pray to Almighty Allah to give him wisdom and ability to successfully administer the University to greater height.

"I wish to congratulate you on this well deserved appointment. I pray to Allah SWT to grant you wisdom and the ability to give in your best so as to make Federal University, Kashere one of the best citadels of learning in this part of the country." said the Chairman of the Council.

Shortly after receiving the letter, the new Vice Chancellor, Professor Umaru A. Pate, thanked the Almighty Allah for the success and promised to do his best to make the University great. He also thanked the Council for finding him worthy to lead the University. "Insha Allah we will do our utmost best to make this University great. May Allah be our guide and give us the strength and wisdom to discharge this mandate excellently."

The new VC was born on 4<sup>th</sup> January, 1964 in Song Adamawa State. He graduated from University of Maiduguri in 1988 where he studied BA (Hons) Mass Communication. He got his Mphil from the University of Legon in Ghana and PhD in 1997 from University of Maiduguri. Prof. Pate bagged his Professor in Media and Society in 2007.

He started his working career with the Nigerian Television Authority (NTA) Yola in 1982. He joined the services of University of Maiduguri as a Graduate Assistant in 1988 and rose through the ranks to become a professor in 2007. He transferred his services to Bayero University, Kano in 2014. Professor Pate was appointed pioneer Dean of the Faculty of Communication and later Dean, School of postgraduate Studies in Bayero University, Kano. He published a number of books and many papers in journals across the globe. He was also an external examiner to many Universities from within and outside the country. Presently, he is the President of Association of Communication Scholars and Practitioners of Nigeria.

## BUK Staff Primary School Holds 50th Anniversary, Gets over N7m

Bayero University, Kano Staff Primary School on Tuesday, 29<sup>th</sup> December, 2020 held its 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration and fund raising for the renovation of the school.

The ceremony brought together graduates of the school from the first set up to the recent ones including past and present teachers as well past headmasters, head teachers and several others.

The grand ceremony was organized by the Bayero University Kano Staff Primary School Old Pupils Association (BUKOPA) under the chairmanship of Kabiru Dayyabu Marmara.

Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, who was the chief host, said it was a great day for BUK as stakeholders gathered to salvage the staff school

especially at this time when education "particularly in Northern Nigeria has deteriorated."

According to him, "if we fail to revitalize the foundation of education from grassroots, the situation will be worse than what we are experiencing at the moment." He reiterated the University's serious determination to ensure that the lost glory of the school is brought back.

The Vice Chancellor explained that one of the factors that militated against the school's backwardness was the habit of staff members who used their influence to bring many pupils citing one staff member who brought fifty children in his name. "We will not allow such ill mannered attitude to destroy what we have worked so hard to revive," he added.

Prof. Abbas commended those who contributed

towards the revival of the school and averred that the University would complete the remaining work, saying that despite the fact that parents will not pay school fees, but will take care of their wards' upkeep including uniform and books.

Presenting a keynote address titled: Community, Private or Public Schools: Consequences of Ineffective Basic Education, the Guest Speaker, Professor Abdulrashid Garba, said 50 years is ripe for BUK Staff Primary School to look back, to assess the journey so far, to count achievements and failures, shortfalls and assess strength, as well as weaknesses all for purpose of strategizing the future.

He said it was quite instructive to note that it is mandatory for all stakeholders to do whatever is within their power to stamp out all actions and inactions that

tend to render Basic Education ineffective.

"We must also, as stakeholders, contribute in bringing about worthwhile ideas and support for ensuring Basic Education remain effective, functional and goal oriented," he added.

Prof Garba argued that one of the factors that caused banditry, kidnapping and other forms of insecurity is the lack of basic education as most of the criminal elements were dropped out from school. He called for the rejuvenation and revitalization of basic education as a form of ending terrorism and insecurity facing the country.

In his remarks, the *Murshid* of the National Mosque, Professor Shehu Galadanchi,

recalled that BUK Staff Primary School was among the very few best schools in Kano as many prominent figures in the state approached him to enroll their children and wards.

Prof. Galadanchi, who initiated the idea of establishing the school when he was a Provost of Abdullahi Bayero College (now BUK), said he was indeed happy and appreciative as the Vice Chancellor promised to ensure the revival of the school.

Also speaking, the Chief *Imam* of Kano, Professor Muhammad Sani Zahraddeen, recounted how BUK Staff School became a model of excellence at a time when there was good relationship among the parents, teachers and pupils. "Everyone at that time was respecting one another and had the zeal and passion for study," he said.

Prof Zahraddeen, commended the founding teachers of the school for working tirelessly to make the school better such as the first head master, Faruk Durumin Iya, the first headmistress, Hajiya Hadiza B. Lavers and Mamman Hildi. He said the contributions they gave would forever be cherished and celebrated.

An alumnus of the school, Professor Hadiza Galadanchi, who chaired the fund raising ceremony, said "quality of graduates of the school is appealing," as the school graduated prominent figures in the country, calling on them to donate generously to ensure the revival of the school.

Malam Sule Ademoh, in his remarks, urged government to come to the aid of the school so that it

will continue to graduate quality graduates.

In his remarks, President of BUKOPA, Comrade Kabiru Nayaya Marmara disclosed that the members of the association had worked assiduously towards ensuring the success of the ceremony and commended all those who participated in one way or another. He said their dream was to unite past and present graduates who came to fruition with the assistance of the school's management and elders who served the school in different capacities.

Over seven million naira was realized at the fund raising event with Tajuddeen Aminu Dantata donating five million (N5m) and Alhaji Umar Bala donating one million naira (N1m).
