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# VC Receives In-house Training Committee Report ... Pleages to Implement Recommendations

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas has advised staff of the University to show commitment and dedication to their duties.

He spoke on Tuesday, 19<sup>th</sup> January, 2021 in his office when he received a report from the Committee on Non-Teaching in-House Training. He also lamented a situation whereby staff report to their duty post very late and close early, which will not augur well for the image of the University.

Professor Abbas noted that University work is a collective one and that each an every staff must be seen to be doing the right thing. He said his administration attached greater premium on staff welfare as well as provision of conducive atmosphere for effective service delivery.

The Vice Chancellor said that staff must change their attitude and be committed to work. "We need to get things in order, so as to get value for our money. This could only be possible if we show commitment to what we are assigned in our respective duty posts," said the Vice-Chancellor.

Professor Sagir Abbas, who commended the committee for what he termed as an excellent job, said the report would go a long way in the history of the University as one of the best things that ever happened in the quest to make Bayero University great.

In particular, he said the management would carefully study the committee's report and systematically implement its recommendations especially in the aspect of staff training and manpower development, which he said is the key to improving the capacity of the workforce.

According to him, training and retraining is very critical in any organization yearning for growth and development, pointing out that the Staff Training Unit would be given a boost by reorganizing its operations so as to be actively get involved in regular training.

The Chairman of the Committee, Dr Sani Ibrahim Amin said the Committee had extensively covered a wide range of areas with a view to making adequate arrangements in the area of staff capacity development and mentoring in the system.

Dr. Amin thanked the Vice Chancellor for the opportunity given to the committee to serve the University and promised to do more whenever they are called upon. He explained that if the recommendations were fully implemented, Bayero University would be second to none in terms of discipline and quality workforce in Nigerian Universities.

Some of the recommendations included; regular training of all cadre of staff as well as ensuring mentoring so as not to create vacuums in the system.

Presenting the vehicle to the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, on Tuesday, 28<sup>th</sup> January, 2021 at the Abubakar Rasheed Senate Building, the President and founder of MAAUN, Professor Adamu Abubakar Gwarzo, said the gesture was part of the effort to further concretise linkages and collaboration with BUK for mutual benefit.

The President, who was represented by Director International Linkages, Collaborations and affiliations, Dr. Bala Muhammad Tukur, promised

more support to BUK, describing the gesture as part of the appreciation for the wonderful support and assistance being rendered to them at their formation and take off period.

## Mambayya House, MacArthur Foundation Complete 3 Year Anti-corruption Programme

The Aminu Kano Centre for Democratic Studies (Mambayya House) has conducted a close-out and dissemination workshop to mark the end of a 3 year anti-corruption programme sponsored by the John D. and Catherine T. McArthur Foundation.

The programme was funded by a grant awarded to Mambayya House from January 1st, 2018 to December 31st, 2020 to carry out a range of anti-corruption activities using faith-based platforms in Northern Nigeria.

The workshop, which was held on Wednesday, 27<sup>th</sup> January, 2021, tagged: **Combating Corruption through Interfaith Platforms in Nigeria**, served as the completion of the project which started in January 2018 to December 2020 with Mambayya House as the main guarantee of the project.

Declaring the workshop open, the Director of Mambayya House, Professor Ismaila Mohammed

Zango, who was represented by the Deputy Director (Training & Documentation), Dr. Samaila Sulaiman, stated that the workshop titled: **Close-Out and Dissemination**, was to mark the end of the three-year Mac Arthur project.

He disclosed that the project started in 2018 with Mambayya House as the main grantee and other four sub-grantees namely: the Interfaith Network Against Corruption (INAC) based in Kano, Interfaith Mediation Centre (IMAC) based in Kaduna, Interfaith Anti-Corruption Network in Nigeria (IANN) based in Lagos and the University of Nigeria, Nsukka Muslim Community (UNNMC), Nsukka.

Dr. Samaila further disclosed that the project, which was designed to complement and support government's anti-corruption drive by mobilizing communities' efforts against corruption through interfaith platforms in Nigeria, had been productive and rewarding as far as the objectives of the programme are concerned, noting that the results showed a successful implementation of various anti-corruption programmes by all implementing partners of the project across all the four geo-political zones of the country.

While presenting a report, the Project Coordinator, Malam Abdullahi Usman K/Naisa, stated that the project had funded series of activities during the three year implementation period, adding that 43 activities were conducted by Mambayya House as a sub-grantee within 33 months from March 2018 to December 2020.

He revealed that 377 persons directly benefited from the activities carried out during the period of the project

cutting across gender, religious affiliations and geo-political zones and more than 60 organizations benefited across the North. He said 27 of them rolled down the training to their members and host communities, while six of them were financially supported by Mambayya House—MacArthur Project.

Similarly, the representative of one of the subgrantees, Interfaith Network Against Corruption (INAC), Dr. Moses T. Aluaigba, in his presentation, explained that a series of anticorruption activities were conducted by the INAC as a sub-grantee under the project, which included annual catch-them-young sensitization programs in selected primary schools in Northern Nigeria, establishment and support of anti-corruption clubs in selected secondary schools in Northern Nigeria, establishment and support of anti-

corruption clubs in selected tertiary institutions in Nigeria, conduct of annual anti-corruption sensitization meetings with youth groups in the 3 geopolitical zones and tracking budgets of selected state governments in Northern Nigeria.

Also presenting the Survey Report, Malam Ibrahim Adamu Basirka of the Department of Sociology, explained that the survey revealed that the phenomenon of corruption in Nigeria is glaring and pervasive and that its impacts are perceived and felt by the majority, who have been forced to live under terrible conditions of ignorance, poverty, misery, hunger and diseases.

He said the survey provides comprehensive data on the perception of religious leaders/FBOs and general public on corruption. He said it explains the role of religious leaders/FBOs in combating corruption in Northwestern Nigeria and collected evidence of how religious leaders educate and mobilize their communities towards anti-corruption crusade.

He concluded that the study showed that major factors responsible for pervasive nature of corruption in Nigeria include: lack of transparency and accountability in governance, culture of acceptance of corrupt practices by the general public, dysfunctional legal system, moral/religious laxity among citizens, among others.

The study recommended that religious leaders should lead by example and match words with action in their quest to salvage Nigeria from the destructive effects of corruption. It also suggested that special sessions dedicated to messages on corruption should be introduced in mosques and churches.
