ACReSAL Team Visits CDA to Strengthen Partnership By Nura Garba

On Tuesday, September 17, 2024, the National Project available at the Centre. The visit aimed to reinforce the partnership between ACReSAL and the CDA in addressing climate and land degradation challenges in Northern Nigeria.

The ACReSAL team was warmly received by CDA Director, Prof. Jibrin Mohammad Jibrin, at the Centre's



Conference Hall. ACReSAL, a World Bank-financed initiative, focuses on combating land degradation and mitigating the effects of climate change in 19 northern Nigerian states and the Federal Capital Territory (FCT).

Mr. Umar expressed his admiration for the CDA's management, its infrastructure, and the modern facilities

between ACReSAL and CDA holds significant potential for achieving both institutions' shared objectives.

In his welcome remarks, Prof. Jibrin highlighted CDA's role as a leading research and innovation hub in Africa. having trained numerous students in master's and doctorate programs, as well as thousands through short-term courses. He emphasized the Centre's commitment to exploring further collaborations with ACReSAL.

Prof. Jibrin also gave a brief history of the CDA, explaining its growth from humble beginnings to becoming a recognized Africa Centre of Excellence. He recounted the Centre's early funding from the MacArthur Foundation, which provided an \$800,000 grant, followed by a \$7 million World Bank grant in 2014. The Centre has since earned additional grants and now serves as one of only three host institutions for the Pan-African PASET project, which aims to train 10,000 PhDs in agriculture. The CDA attracts students from 15 African countries and continues to build a "great green wall of knowledge."

Dr. Dahiru Muhammad Hashim, Project Coordinator for Kano ACReSAL, commended the CDA for its longstanding collaboration with Kano ACReSAL, particularly in supporting internship programs. He assured the Centre's involvement in training 500 beneficiaries in the agricultural value chain as part of an upcoming state project. Additionally, CDA will be consulted in the establishment of a compost manure plant in Kano.

The visit concluded with a tour of the CDA's laboratories and its newly built Innovation and Entrepreneurship Hub, showcasing the Centre's cutting-edge research and development facilities.

Al Communication Can Enhance Healthcare, Research in Africa – Prof Hajara Sanda **By Nura Garba**

Professor Hajara Umar Sanda, has submitted that effective health communication, coupled with the integration of artificial intelligence in research, can significantly enhance patient care for the sustainability of healthcare systems. AI-driven innovations such as chatbots, visual assistants and sophisticated data analysis tools are transforming the way health information is disseminated and used according to Prof Sanda.

Professor Hajara Sanda, who presented a paper titled: The Role of Artificial Intelligence in Health Communication: Implications for Digital Communications and Governance in Africa at the 11th Annual conference of the Association of Communication Scholars and Professionals of Nigeria (ACSPN) held at the Ikeja Airport Hotel from 4-5 September, 2024 said artificial intelligence (AI) has burgeoned as a seminal force in health communication, proffering innovative resolutions to the enduring challenges beleaguering Africa's healthcare systems.



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She stated that the integration of AI into Africa's healthcare innovations. systems is not without its challenges, citing (McKinsey, 2024, who said Issues such as the digital divide, infrastructure deficits and the need for capacity building present formidable obstacles to the widespread adoption of AI technologies.

Hajara, who is the first female Professor of Mass Communication in Kano that as we stand on the cusp of an AI revolution in healthcare, it is imperative to harness this technology's transformative power judiciously, ensuring that its benefits reach all corners of Africa and contribute to the continent's long-term health and prosperity.

The paper, which explores the role of AI in health communication within the African context, examining its potential to enhance the efficiency, accuracy and personalization of healthcare delivery, explained that the application of artificial intelligence (AI) in health communication is not uniform across Africa; it varies significantly with each country's unique challenges and technological advancements. However, she pointed out that the integration of AI in health communication across Africa has been met with notable successes in Egypt, South Africa, Nigeria among others, exemplifying the continent's capacity to embrace and implement digital health

Prof Hajara Sanda explicitly explained that the journey towards full realization of the the potential of AI is fraught with challenges that must be surmounted to ensure equitable access to its benefits by addressing the infrastructural development, capacity building and digital divide as well as the need for a robust governance frameworks to ensure the ethical use of AI, data protection and equitable access to all.

She concluded that in the vanguard of digital transformation, artificial intelligence (AI) harbours the potential to revolutionize health communication across Africa, charting a course towards a more enlightened, efficient and tailored healthcare paradigm. As African nations progressively embrace the digital revolution, the integration of AI in health communication is poised to burgeon, mandating judicious governance to amplify its merits and attenuate its perils.

Prof Sanda noted that the promise of AI in enhancing health literacy, patient engagement and the delivery of personalized health interventions is immense as it offers a beacon of hope for surmounting the perennial challenges of healthcare delivery in resource-constrained settings.

Malam Alivu Musa Adam, the Coordinator of the school's Scholarship Scheme, explained that admissions fall into three categories: staff children, non-staff children, and indigent scholarships. He highlighted that 40 pupils from the three local governments were selected for the scholarship this year, with a fair and transparent interview process that also took gender balance into account.

The interview assessed children's abilities in letter recognition, number identification, reading, and writing. To be eligible for admission, a child must be at least six years old, present a birth certificate, and pass an entrance examination.

Chairman of the school's Governing Board, Dr. Kabiru Bello Dungurawa, expressed gratitude to BUK for extending the indigent scholarship as part of its corporate social responsibility to the surrounding communities. He emphasized that the initiative helps parents feel included and provides their children with greater access to education.

Dr. Dungurawa commended the University's efforts in supporting the local communities and stressed that this partnership would encourage more parents to enroll their children at the school.

BUK Dress Code Committee Hosts Workshop to Raise Awareness on Dress Code Enforcement By Suleiman Salihu
