BUK Gets Pass Mark Over Treatment of Physically Challenged Students

Bayero University, Kano has received a pass-mark over its University Library to cater for students with physical treatment of physically challenged students.

This commendation came from the National Universities Commission's (NUC) accreditation team for B.A History on Thursday, 28th November, 2024. The team pointed out that the resources and infrastructures installed in the

deformities were second to none in the entire Nigerian universities.

In his words the team lead, Professor Tamuno Godwin Dappa from Achievers University Owo, Ondo State, "We

found something extraordinary and a take home experience by all of us. BUK is the best so far out of the schools we visited, and the provision of facilities for Physically Challenged people in the University Library is overwhelming. It has been equipped with modern facilities hardly not found anywhere in the country".

He added that Philosophy of the department was in line with the NUC standard, and that admission regulation is up to standard. He hailed the department for leaving up to the standard of the best practices.

In his remark, the Vice Chancellor, Professor Sagir Adamu Abbas, who was represented by the DVC Research and Development, Professor Abdullahi Sule Kano, explained that BUK takes the issue of peer review very seriously.

Centre for Gender Studies Organizes Round-Table **Discussion on 4 Research Publications**

The Centre for Gender Studies (CGS), Bayero University with stakeholders to review reports done by researchers to (RLS), has organized a one-day round-table discussion on four research publications. The discussion took place on Monday, 2nd December, 2024 at the CGS Conference Room.

In her welcome address, the Director of the Centre, Ambassador Dr. Safiya Nuhu Ahmad, said the round-table session was organized to discuss with key stakeholders on four publications that had been conducted between 2023

and 2024 on different topics that were very important and relevant to development and in line with the Centre's areas of cross-cutting interests, supported by the RLS foundation, West Africa.

In her goodwill message, the representative of the RLS, Nigeria, Mrs. Angela Odah, said the foundation started its activities in West Africa in 2010, focusing more of its support on climate justice, economic justice, peace and security, and feminism, among others.

She disclosed that the idea of the round-table was to meet

Kano, in collaboration with Rosa Luxemburg Stiftung identify strength, weaknesses, or gaps with a view to discussing and coming up with recommendations for future researches. She disclosed that similar presentations were taking place at several centres across the states of the federation.

> In her opening remarks, the Chairperson of the programme, Prof. Binta Tijjani Jibril, expressed that the major objective of the RLS in supporting researches was to bring onboard complex and challenging socio-political issues for discussion by academia, stakeholders and policy makers for an effective solution. She called on the RLS foundation to expand its support towards capacity building so as to increase level of awareness of people in the society.

> Amb. Dr. Safiya Nuhu Ahmad presented her paper review on "Experiences and Conditions of Domestic Workers, the Role of Stakeholders and the Strategies in Mitigating Domestics Worker Abuses in the North-West Region, Nigeria." The research was conducted by the CGS-BUK and was critically discussed by participants, among which were poor condition of work (24 work hours a day as against the normal 40 work hours a week by the provision of ILO), health, feeding, underage, sexual harassment and education, among others.

> The recommendations made were proper awareness from the religious leaders, media, puberty eradication, education, and government should enact laws to safeguard the domestic workers, among other things, to be indicated in the research for further studies.

> The impact of Farmers-Herders Crises on Quality of Life of Women and Girls in IDP Camps in North-Central, Nigeria", was reviewed by Prof. Aminu M. Dukku, from the Department of Sociology. The discussion recommended the research work for covering of the prevalence of farmers-herders crisis on "negative of life" women and girls in IDP camps in the North Central, Nigeria, among other things.

Dr. Sabi'u Yarima Zakari, from Department of Sociology, presented his paper review on "the Effect of Bwari Conflict and Enugu Sit-at-home on Women." The discussion critically analyzed the relationship between conflict in Bwari and Enugu Sit-at-home and recommended the splitting of the research work into two, among other things.

Dr. Shukrah Bello of the Department of Business Administration and Entrepreneurship reviewed the work on "Nigeria after COVID-19 Subordinate Integration into the World Economy and Burgeoning Popular Discontent." The discussion critically examined that Nigeria's economic instability was not as a result of a single event (COVID-19) rather it was connected with multiple crises such as oil price shocks, labour market disruptions,

police brutality, among others. The discussion pointed out that the work was more of report rather than a research.

The report was analyzed for improvement on area of engagement with current policy, deeper exploration of financial system reforms, and inclusion of more primary data, among others.

In her vote of-thanks, the Director, CGS, Amb. Dr. Safiya Nuhu Ahmad, thanked the University Management, the Chairperson, Prof. Binta Tijjani Jibril, for her valuable contribution to the success of the event, the team of researchers, the participants drawn from academia, Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) and the media, the representative of the RLS foundation for its support and found the Centre a collaborative partner since 2017.
