CDA, Soil Values Train Farmers on Fertilizer Deep Placement for Vegetables

The Centre for Dryland Agriculture (CDA), Bayero University Kano, in collaboration with the Soil Values Programme, has conducted Green Field Day demonstrations on Fertilizer Deep Placement (FDP) for vegetable production in Kano State.

The demonstrations took place on Saturday, 14th March 2026, in Bagwai Local Government Area and on Sunday, 15th March 2026, in Sumaila Local Government Area.

Speaking during the training, the Deputy Director of Research and Innovation at CDA, Dr. Mustapha Mohammed Bello, said the initiative was designed to strengthen the capacity of extension agents and smallholder farmers through practical knowledge on improved fertilizer management for vegetable crops.

Lead trainer, Muazu Salisu explained that the programme targeted to train 200 participants, comprising 20 extension

agents, 40 lead farmers and 140 smallholder farmers—most of them women from the Yartiti and Kamadogou watersheds in Kano State.

According to him, the training focused on two key areas:

Fertilizer Deep Placement (FDP) technology for vegetable production and Integrated Nutrient Management, which incorporates Good Agricultural Practices such as composting, mulching, proper spacing, and trellising.

He added that the programme combined classroom

lectures with hands-on field demonstrations, allowing participants to compare improved practices with conventional farming methods through “Green” and “Brown” field day assessments.

The initiative aims to promote sustainable vegetable production and improve yields among smallholder farmers across Kano State.

Farmers and extension agents also shared compelling testimonies on the impact of the training. Salisu Danwaki, a lead farmer from Suki Dabula in Bagwai Local Government Area, said the Fertilizer Deep Placement technique has doubled his tomato yield.

Zainab Hassan Rimi, a small holder farmer from Rimi in Sumaila Local Government Area, highlighted how the training on composting and mulching has improved her soil fertility while reducing reliance on chemical fertilizers. She added that the knowledge gained has enabled her to support fellow farmers within her community.

Muhammad Galadima, an extension agent, commended CDA and the Soil Values programme for providing practical, field-based skills, noting that the experience has strengthened his capacity and confidence to guide farmers in adopting sustainable agricultural practices.

Prof. Mahmoud Umar Sani Assumes Office as Pioneer Vice-Chancellor of Jigawa State University of Medical and Allied Health Sciences

A renowned cardiologist, Prof. Mahmoud Umar Sani, has officially assumed office as the Pioneer Vice-Chancellor of the Jigawa State University of Medical and Allied Health Sciences, Majia.

The mantle of leadership of the University was formally handed over to him on Tuesday, 17th March, 2026, by the outgoing Overseer Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Ahmad Muhammed Gumel, during a ceremony held at the University auditorium.

The event attracted a large gathering of staff, students, family members, friends, and well-wishers who came to witness the historic occasion marking the formal commencement of leadership at the newly established medical university.

In his remarks, Prof. Sani expressed profound gratitude to the Executive Governor of Jigawa State, Malam Umar A. Namadi, FCA, for finding him worthy to serve as the pioneer Vice-Chancellor of the institution.

He described the appointment as a great honour and responsibility, noting that it requires dedication, commitment, and collective effort in laying a solid academic foundation for the University.

The new Vice-Chancellor also expressed his readiness to work closely with staff and other relevant stakeholders to transform the institution into a state-of-the-art medical and allied health sciences university capable of producing highly skilled health professionals for the state and the

nation.

Prof. Mahmoud Sani, a Professor of Internal Medicine and renowned cardiologist at the Department of Medicine,

Bayero University Kano, and Aminu Kano Teaching Hospital (AKTH), previously served as the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Management Services) at Bayero University, Kano. He was appointed to the position by the University Governing Council following a nomination by the Senate for a two-year term from 2021 to 2023.

His areas of research interest include Acute Heart Failure, Echocardiography, Cardiovascular Epidemiology, and Heart Disease in HIV. Prof. Sani has been actively involved as Principal Investigator (PI) and Multi-Principal Investigator (MPI) in several collaborative clinical trials and medical registries both regionally and internationally.

He is also an investigator under the Sickle Cell Disease Genomics Network of Africa (SickleGenAfrica) project, which seeks to build local capacity for African scientists to study the genomics of sickle cell disease on the continent. Within the network, he leads a major research project titled “Genomics of Cardiovascular Phenotypes in Sickle Cell Disease,” aimed at analysing key echocardiographic cardiovascular biomarkers among 2,000 adults living with sickle cell disease in Africa.

Directorate of Academic Planning Trains Staff on Statistical Package for Social Sciences

The Directorate of Academic Planning (DAP), Bayero University, Kano through its Continuous Professional Development and Digital Education (CPD&DE) has organized a two-day train-the-trainers capacity building workshop on Statistical Package for Social Sciences (SPSS).

The Workshop took place on Wednesday 11th and Thursday 12th March, 2026 at Staff Training Unit, Floor 2, Abubakar Rasheed, Senate Building, BUK New Campus.

In his opening remarks, the Director of Academic Planning, Prof. Yusuf Garba, represented by the Deputy Director (CPD&DE), Prof. Nurudeen Salahudeen, noted that the workshop was aimed at improving the capacity of staff members on their respective jobs, adding that the selections of the sixty-five (65) expected participants had made regardless of their cadre, rank or position in the University.

Prof. Salahudeen stated that the workshop was apt and timely considering the global and dynamic changes on ideas that revolves around knowledge. He stated that technologies and ways of doing things had changed at a very fast and unprecedented pace. “Knowledge remains at the centre, shaping the dynamism of ideas and technologies,” he stressed.

He noted that University Management through the CPD&DE of Directorate Academic Planning was committed of making impactful contributions of changing today's ideas into tomorrow's breakthrough, noting that this could only achieved through embracing the culture of

Prof. Sani has been a member of the Bayero University Senate since 2012 and has served on several university committees. Over the years, he has held a number of important academic and administrative positions, including Head of the Department of Medicine, Bayero University Kano (2012–2014); Deputy Provost (Academics), College of Health Sciences (2016–2018); and Dean, Faculty of Clinical Sciences, BUK (2018–2020).

Beyond the University, he served as a Council Member of the Nigerian Cardiac Society from 2006 to 2012 and has been an Examiner to the West African College of Physicians since 2008. He was also selected as a World Heart Federation (WHF) Emerging Leader in 2015.

The ceremony also featured special prayers for divine guidance and wisdom for the new Vice-Chancellor, with participants praying for a successful tenure that will bring meaningful development and lasting benefits to the people of Jigawa State and Nigeria at large.

Prof. Salahudeen further stated that the period of the CPD training was carefully planned to commence the first batch of the 2024/2025 session, having completed the undergraduate examinations for the active participation of the staff members comprising both teaching and non-teaching drawn from faculties, departments and units of

the University.

Prof. Salahudeen urged participants to actively participate in the two-day train-the-trainers model and to kindly transfer the knowledge obtained to other staff at their respective domain. He wished participants a successful training session.

At the day-one session, Dr. Bala Shehu of the Department of Mathematical Sciences, BUK, presented a paper titled: *“Introduction to SPSS,” “Installation and Operations of SPSS,” “Descriptive Data Analysis Using SPSS,”* and *“Hands on Practical Session.”*

In the presentation, Dr. Shehu defined SPSS as statistical package for social sciences, he explained the two main windows in SPSS to include *Data Editor* and *Output Viewer* with annotated examples.

The instructor took the participants through modules of parametric frequencies and descriptions. He highlighted that frequencies and descriptive could be used for any numeric variable, adding that frequencies were also used for string variables, using examples to guide the

participants.

Dr. Shehu advanced reasons through analyzing Parametric variables through Group and Ungroup data, Comparison, ANOVA, Relationship and Correlation co-efficient, among others. He also explained Non-parametric, including Chi-squares; Kruskal-Wallis Test and Friedman's ANOVA, and how to input data from the questionnaire into SPSS, among other things.

In his remarks, the Director of Academic Planning, Prof. Yusuf Garba, stated that the Directorate was making effort to make the training an annual routine especially in the end of every semester, adding that the Directorate was committed through exploring ways to expand the workshop to reach the various staff on the need.

BUK, NSCDC Move to Strengthen Security in Host Communities

The Nigeria Security and Civil Defence Corps (NSCDC), Hawan Dawaki–Danbare Outpost, on Wednesday, 11 March 2026, paid a courtesy visit to the Vice Chancellor of Bayero University, Kano (BUK), Prof. Haruna Musa, to address growing security concerns affecting students residing off campus in the Hawan Dawaki–Danbare area.

The delegation, led by the Officer-in-Charge of the outpost, DSC Baba Hussaini Yaro, included the Head of Intelligence and Investigation Unit, ASC Hassan Umar, alongside other officials. The visit focused on fostering collaboration between the Corps and the University to enhance the safety of students living in surrounding

outpost to effectively discharge its mandate. He further appealed for the University's backing in organizing a sensitization workshop aimed at educating students on the dangers of crime and other anti-social activities.

Responding, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Haruna Musa expressed appreciation for the visit and the goodwill extended to him. He acknowledged the efforts of the NSCDC in supporting the University and its host communities, assuring that BUK under his leadership would continue to work closely with relevant security agencies.

He reiterated the University's commitment to maintaining a safe environment for students, noting that while off-campus security falls outside the direct jurisdiction of the institution, it remains a critical concern.

The Vice Chancellor pledged sustained collaboration with agencies such as the NSCDC, the Department of State Services (DSS), the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA), and the Nigeria Police Force to enhance safety within and around the University.

Prof. Musa also advised the NSCDC to engage traditional rulers and landlords in the affected communities to develop measures that would ensure proper identification of prospective tenants before accommodation is granted.

He further expressed readiness to support the proposed sensitization workshop and directed the Acting Director of Security to partner with the NSCDC and the Students' Union Government (SUG) to ensure its success. He emphasized the importance of continuous engagement with host communities as part of broader efforts to improve security around the University.

The Vice Chancellor reaffirmed BUK's commitment to strategic collaboration with the NSCDC and other stakeholders, while offering prayers for continued success in their collective efforts to safeguard lives and property.

BUK Senate Expels 171 Students for Falsification of Entry Qualifications

The Senate of Bayero University, Kano (BUK), at its 433rd meeting held on March 4, 2026, has approved the expulsion of 171 students for falsifying their admission entry qualifications.

The decision followed the consideration and approval of the report submitted by the Senate Committee on Entry Qualification Irregularities, which investigated cases relating to discrepancies in admission credentials.

The affected students were found to have falsified the qualifications presented for admission into the University, an act which constitutes a violation under Section 20.7, Category A (vii) of the University's General Examinations and Academic Regulations (GEAR), which prescribes expulsion for students found guilty of falsifying entry qualifications.

In a related development, the Senate also approved the expulsion of Yusuf Muhammad Sani (ENG/18/CIV/00065) of the Department of Civil Engineering for engaging in physical violence against invigilators during the conduct of an examination.

The incident, which disrupted the smooth conduct of the examination, was also found to be in violation of Section 20.7, Category A (vii) of the University's General Examinations and Academic Regulations (GEAR).

The University reiterated its commitment to upholding the highest standards of academic integrity and discipline, stressing that any breach of its regulations will continue to attract appropriate sanctions in accordance with established rules.
